HE Prince of Afturias returned hither from the Pardo on the 11th Inftant in the Morning to vifit the Princels his Confort, who is now perfectly recovered of her late Indifposition : The Prince went back the fame Day to the Pardo. On the 12th the Marquels de Grimaldo Secretary of State came hither from the Pardo to affift at a Junta of the Ministers held in the House of the Marquels de Campo Florido, who was indifpoled, in order to fettle the Fund for the publick Services of the prefent Year. It is faid that the Ambaffadous of Malta has represented to this Court, that if the Succours which are promised to be sent from hence, be deferred till after the Turks are put to Sea with their Fleet, it will be difficult to land there the Troops defigned for the Affiftance of that Island, and therefore defires such Measures may be taken that they may be all there before the End of March next The Offi-cers of the Royal Houshold who were fent to the Frontiers to wait the Arrival of Mademoiselle de Beaujolois, have ftopt at Yrum : Tis faid that Princels was taken ill on the Road, which occasioned her to make very flow and easy Journics, and had retarded her Arrival at Yrum fo foon as was expected. An Opera is to be represented at the Theatre of the Buen-Retiro, and a Confort of Mufick is also to be performed there when that Princels makes her Entry into this City, there are also to be Fireworks on that Occasion. On the 16th in the Evening the Duke de Popoli died here after a few Days illness of a Quinzy attended with a Fever, which at first his Physitions made flight of; his Body was conveyed last Night in a private Manner to the Convent of Capuchins of St. Antonio to be deposited

there without Pomp, according to his Defire expressed in his Will. By his Death the Offices of Chief Major-Domo to the Prince of Asturias, and of Captain of a Troop in the Italian Regiment of Life-Guards are become vacant. The Prince de Petorano his only Son, who is an Exempt in the fame Troop of Guards, folicits to succeed his Father as Captain of it. The Courier is returned from Bayone, whither he had been dispatched with a Passfort for the Chevalier d'Orleans, who is expected here the 21ft Instant.
