The Chevalier d'Orleans arrived here the 22d, and was Yesterday to make his Compliments to their Catholick Majefties and the Royal Family at the Pardo. It is not known yet when the Court will remove from thence, but it is fuppoled the Day will be fixed when Advice comes of the Arrival of Mademoiselle de Beaujolois at Buitrago. The Princess of Asturias being intirely recovered of her Indisposition, has been at the Pardo to make her Visits to the King and Queen, and this Evening an Opera is to be represented for her Entertain-ment at the Italian Theatre here. The Employments vacant by the Death of the Duke of Popoli, are not yet disposed of, there being feveral Competitors who make great Sollici-Lations.

Paris, Feb. 6, N. S. That on the 9th the Pope figned an Order for iffuing the Sum of 26000 Crowns, to go towards the Charge of the Supplies of Ammunition and Providons which he has refolved to furnish to the Order of Malta.
