At *St. James's, February 15.* A humble Address of the High Sheriff, Justices of the Peace, Grand Jury, Gentlemen, and Freeholders of the County of Lymerick, having been transmitted by the Lords Justices of Ireland to his Grace the Duke of Grafton Lord Lieutenant of that Kingdom, has by him been presented to His Majesty, who was pleased to receive it very graciously.

Madrid, Feb. 8, N. S. On the 30th past their Catholick Majesties, with the Prince of Asturias, returned from the Pardo to the Royal Palace here. We have Advice, that Mademoiselle de Beaujolois, whom this Court now styles the Infanta, arriving on the Frontier of France the 25th of last Month, the Duke of Ossuna, commissioned for that Purpose, immediately waited on her Royal Highness, to compliment her on her happy Arrival and make her a Present of Jewels in the Name of their Catholick Majesties: His Excellency having settled with the Duke of Duras the Ceremony of her Reception into Spain, it was performed the next Day with the usual Solemnity and Splendour; and her Royal Highness being conducted to Yrum, Te Deum was sung in the Principal Church of that Place on the Occasion. On the 27th her Royal Highness set forward on her Journey to this Court; was expected at Burgos the 6th Instant; and their Catholick Majesties will set out from hence the 12th to meet her at Guadalaxara, where it is thought her Royal Highness will arrive the 16th. Her Royal Highness was to have come by the Way of Buytrago, but upon Notice that the Small-Pox is rife in that Town, the Court ordered the Route to be changed to that of Guadalaxara.

Whereas by the Act now lately passed in Parliament for continuing the Duty on Malt, Mum, Cyder and Perry for the Service of the Year 1723, it is (amongst other things) enacted, That the Money to be advanced by the Contributors or Adventurers in the present Lottery, shall be paid to the Receivers thereof at such Time or Times, and by such Proportion at a Time, (on or before the 24th Day of June 1723) as shall be appointed by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in that behalf: Their Lordships, in Pursuance of the Powers given to them as aforesaid, have assigned and appointed, That all Contributors or Adventurers on the said Act, do pay one Moiety of the Sums which they shall think fit to contribute, to some one of the Cashiers of the Bank of England (whom their Lordships have appointed Receivers thereof) on or before the 28th Day of February Instant, and the other Moiety on or before the 25th Day of March following.
