E have Advice here, that the Spaniards have agreed to fuccour the **VV** Maltele with 3000 Foot, in lieu of the Men of War which they had promifed to furnish them with; and this Court is inclined to supply the Island of Malta with a Sum of Money infland of the Barry W a Sum of Money, instead of the Four Men of War which were expected from his Por-tuguele Majefty. Our laft Letters from Cadiz mention, that His Britannick Majefty's Ship the Falmouth was gone up to Genoa, as was the Panther to Port-Mahon. The Leopard, Colchefter, and Lime are in this Harbour. The Infanta Donna Maria, eldeft Daughter of their Portuguele Majesties, lies at this Time ill of the Small-Pox; but it proves of the beft Sort, and her Royal Highnels is thought out of all Danger.

Vienna, Fcb. 13. Letters from Constan-tinople of the 12th of January advile, that the Pasha of Babylon had confirmed the Account of the Affairs of Persia, fent by the Pasha of Van; though they were still in Doubt as to fome Particulars relating to the Death of the late King and of his Children. Certain it is, that Mirvicz has been declared King; and the Porte has received Advice, that he proposes to fend soon an Ambasily thither, to confirm the Peace between the two Empires.

Paris, Feb. 27. Instead of the Council of Regency a Royal Council is formed, confifting of his Royal Highnels the Duke of Orleans, the Duke of Chartres, the Duke of Bourbon, the Cardioal du Bois, and the Bifhop of Frejus. M. Galiczin is arrived here, and is making Preparations to go to Madrid, where he is to refide as Minister of the Çzar.
