**T**HE Assembly of the Burghers has agreed with those of the Nobility and Clergy, in a Resolution not to make any Alteration in the present established Form of the Government of this Kingdom. Which Resolution has been signified to the Peasants, who having judged some Alteration necessary, had desired the Concurrence of those other States.

*Hague, March 16, N. S.* The Marquess de Monteleone the Spanish Ambassadour, had a Conference Yesterday with the Deputies of the States General, when he acquainted them by Order from his Court, that a Squadron of Ships to be commanded by the Marquess de Mari is fitting out at Cadiz, to act this Summer against the Algerines, in Conjunction with the Squadron which this State shall think fit to send into the Mediterranean, and which he desired might be ordered thither with all possible Dispatch. The Deputies of the Admiralties being now here to be consulted about fitting out of the said Squadron, it is expected a final Resolution upon that Affair will be taken in a few Days. Eight Deputies from Zealand are arrived here to confer with the States of Holland about their Maritime Affairs and the Farming of the Customs, in order to which they presented Yesterday to the Assembly their Powers or Credentials. Letters from Moscow relate, that Baron Schaffiroff, Chancellour to the Czar, had by his Order been taken into Custody, and all his Papers and Effects secured, and that since his Confinement he had charged Prince Menzicoff and Admiral Apraxin with the same Crimes he is accused of.

*Spanish-Town in Jamaica, Dec. 26.* His Grace the Duke of Portland, with his Retinue, arrived safe here on the 22d Instant; and was received with all Demonstrations of publick Joy.
