**O**UR Letters from Florence advise, that the Marquis Corsini, eldest Brother of the Marquis of that Name now residing at Cambray as Minister from the Great Duke, is made Chief Ranger to his Highness. Prince Theodore of Bavaria, who had passed some Time here, is gone from hence to Rome. Orders are come to several Parts of Italy, for all such Knights of Malta as are of the Age of 19 Years compleat, and all those above that Age who have not yet served in any military Expedition, to repair forthwith to the Island of Malta: But the more antient Knights, who have formerly been in Service, are excused from repairing thither, till they receive a third peremptory Summons. From Leghorne we have an Account, that by Letters from Algiers it was confirmed, that the Algerine Squadron had put to Sea, in order to join the Ottoman Fleet in the Dardanells: They add, that the Turks were storing Magazines at several Places on the Coasts of Barbary, for supplying their Fleet as Occasion may require.

*Turin, March 10, N. S.* On the 7th Instant about Nine a Clock at Night the Princess Royal of Piedmont was safely delivered of a Prince, who was soon after baptized, the Marquis de la Pierre being Proxy for the Prince of Sultzbach as Godfather, and

the Princess de la Cisterna for Madame Royale as Godmother; and he was named Victor Amedée Theodore. Her Royal Highness was taken very ill that Night, and continued so bad, that she was not judged to be out of Danger till Yesterday. To-Day Te Deum is to be sung, and Orders are given for Illuminations to be made throughout the City this and the three following Nights; and extraordinary Rejoycings will be made at Court on this joyful Occasion. His Sardinian Majesty and the Prince Royal have sent Letters, to be delivered to the King of Great Britain, by the Marquis de Cortance, his Sardinian Majesty's Minister residing at London, notifying the Birth of the young Prince. The Count de Maffey is appointed to go with like Letters of Notification to the Court of France; and the Chevalier de Villette, his Sardinian Majesty's Master of the Horse, sets out To-morrow for Sultzbach, on the same Occasion.

*Cambray, March 11, N. S.* His Excellency the Lord Polwarth, one of the British Ambassadors Plenipotentiary to the Congress here, gave this Day a very magnificent Entertainment to all the Foreign Ministers and other Persons of Distinction residing in this City, on Occasion of the Birth-Day of her Royal Highness the Princess of Wales, which is To-morrow: But that being a Fast-Day, his Excellency chose to celebrate the said Anniversary To-Day.
