W Hereas by an Order made by His Majefty in Council of the 5th Day of February, in the Seventh Year of His Reign, and in the Year of our Lord 1720, reciting that Marfeil-les and other Places in Provence in France, then continued to be infected with the Plague, and that Kidskins, Silk, Cotton, Human Hair, and other Goods apt to retain Infection were ufually brought from Languedoc, and Parts thereaboute, to Bourdeaux and other Places in the Bay of Bilcay on the Coaft of France, and that Ships and Veffels with Perfons and Goods on board coming from the Mediterranean and Places on the Coaft of France in the Bay of Bifcay, frequently touched at the lifes of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, and that a Trade was carried on by the Inhabitants of those liles with the feveral Places beforenamed, and with Ships which had touch-

and reciting, that from and after the Tenth Day of February 1720, an AA made in the Ninth Year of the Reign of Her late Majefty Queen Anne [Intituled, An Act to oblige Ships coming from Places infected, more effectually to perform their Quarantam] as to all Matters and Things to arile or be done from and after the faid 10th Day of February, would be and ftand absolutely repealed by Virtue of an Act paffed the then prefent Seffion of Parliament, Intituled, [An Act for repealing An Act made in the Ninth Year of the Reign of Her late Majefty Queen Anne, [Intituled, An Act to oblige Ships coming from Places infected, more effectually to perform their Quarantain, and for the better preventing the Plague being brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain or Ireland, or the liles of Guernsey. Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, and to hinder the lpreading Infection] His Majefty out of His great Care for the Prefervation of his People, and to pre-vent the Infection that might be brought by Ships or Veffels coming into the Ports of this Kingdom, or of the lifes of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the faid Places, by His faid Order in Council directed and required, That all Ships and Veffels, and Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes, coming or imported in the fame, arriving in any Port or Place within Great Britain, from and after the faid 10th Day of February, from the Mediterranean, or from Bourdeaux, or any of the Ports or Places on the Coaft of France in the Bay of Bifcay, or from the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, or any of them, and alfo all Ships and Veffels, and Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes, coming or imported in the fame, arriving in any Port or Place within any of the faid Ifles of ed there with Goods apt to retain Infection, | Guernsey, Jerley, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from
