By the King, A PROCLAMATION, For a Publick Thanklgiving. GEORGE R.

WHereas it hash pleased Almighty God, out of His infinite Mercy, to preferve Us and Our Subjets from that dreadful Plague, with which the Kingdom of France was lately vifited, and to put an End to the fame : We therefore adoring the Devine Goodnefs, and duly confidering that fuch Great and Publick Bleffings do call for Publick and Solemn Acknowledgements, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation. hereby appointing and commanding, That a General Thanksgiving and commanaing. That a General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for these His Mercies, be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain, called Scotland, upon Thursday the Twenty fifth Day of April next. And We do striktly Charge and Command, That the faid Publick Thank friving be reverently and decently observed, by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, on the said Twenty fifth Day of April next, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid his Wrath and Indignati-on, and upon Pain of fuch Puni/bment, as We may justly inflict on all fuch as Contemn or Neglett the Performance of fo Religious a Duty: Our Will and Pleasure is therefore, and we charge, that incontinent, this our Royal Proclamation feen, ye pass to the Market-Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there in our Name and Authority make Publication thereof, that none and Authority make Publication thereof, that none pretend Ignorance. And Our Will and Pleafure is, That Our Solicitor do caufé Printed Copies here-of to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Baillues of Regulities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame publifhed; and We appoint them to fend Doubles thereof to the feveral Paroch-Kirks within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day, immediately preceding the Day above mentioned, the fame may preceding the Day above mentioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

Given at Our Court af Sr. James's the Twelfth Day of March, 1722, in the Ninth Year of Our Reign: God fave the King.
