HIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in his Royal Robes feated on the Throne, with the usual Solemnity, Sir William Sanderfon, Gentleman-Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the Houfe of Peers ; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Ma-

jefty was pleafed to give the Royal Alfent to An AS for reviving and adding Two Millions to the Capital Stock of the South-Sea Company, and for revi-ving a proportional Part of the Yearly Fund payable at the Exchequer, and for dividing their whole Capital (after fuch Addision made) into Two equal Parts or -Moieties, and for converting One of the faid Moieties into certain Annuities, for the Benefit of the Mombers;

and for fettling the remaining Mosety in the faid Company; and for continuing for one Year longer, the Pro-willion formerly made against requiring special Bsil in Astions or Saits upon such Contracts as are therein

mentioned.

An Alt for redeeming certain Annuities payable by the Cashire of the Bank of England, at the Rate of Five - Pounds per Cent. per Annum. An Att for punishing Mutiny and Defertion, and for
