Province, at present assembled at Ghent, to a deterministion in the matter of the Sublidies; fo that it is thought, his Excellency will be forced to make an other journey thither, to see that affair wholly concluded before he goes for Gelderland. The Marquis d' Offera having been to take possession of his Government of the Casile at Answerp, is returned hither again.

Several pretenders appear for the Government of the Caffle of Ghent, but amongst others, the Heer Pards Governor of Dendermund the Sieur Alvarda Governor of Newport and the Maisfre de Camp Spipols, are faid to fland the fairest for ut.

Briffels, Ofto 7. Yesterday the Magiblescy and Commonalty of this place, being in the usual manper allembled, after some debate contented in as much as concerneth their particulars to the 1200 thousand Gilders given by the States of Brabant for the epsping year.

It is hoped this good example may induce Antwerp and Leeuwe, to a quick concurrence with the self of that Province in this matter. The States of Flanders have likewise contented to the raising a Subfidy of 1800 thousand Gilders, to the great latisfaction of our Governor the Count de Monterer. Id is faid that his Excellency will begin his journey yet this week for Gelderland.

Amfterdars, Otto. 6. We hear of nothing here but loftes and great dammages fuffered it he late florms; Econishe Fexel we are told, of two Ships that were loft.coming in there with Salt fro Elubes; That a finall Vellel arriving there, the a new fooke of above 20 wrecks they had leen all og the Coaft of Flanders; feveral finall Boats which went with goods, and paffengers from place to place, through the Inland waters, have been likewife loft, together with all the people on hoard them.

Hague, Odo. 5. On Munday last arrived here the Heer Lieutenant Admiral do Ruyter from Gaeno, where he had put in with his Squadron of men of War; the fame day he was in the affembly of the States General, to give them a particular account of the prefent condition of the Fleet, which we understand fuffered little dammage in the late bad weather, even beyond what we could have hoped, conlidering the lad effects we hear from all parts of these violent florms. Here is a difcourfe about Town, as if the States would keep the greateft part of the Seamen that have been this Summer on hord their Fleet in their fervice all this winter, giving them half pay, that fo they might be ready at hand, in cale they might have occasion for them the next Spring.

I The Province of Zealand hath by their Deputies here, conferred to the farther keeping on foot the new railed Troops. It is faid, that the Heer de Hairen of Friefland, is to go Amballador to Smeden and Danemark. The Heer van Brederade continues very ill, though st is hoped, that the worlt of his diffemperis paft.

His Highnols the Prince of Orange is asrived from Dieren, at Zuyleffein, where his Highnels intends to continue some days; the Heer vin Odycke is gone likewise thither to confer with his Highnels concerning some affairs relating to the Province of Zealand. The States of Holland continue fill affembled.

Hague, Octo. 8. The States of Holland have lately made a vefolution for the taking away all Priviledges from. Ambassiadors and other publick Minis sters, in regard they fay their Ministers do not enjoy any in any Forreign Court. It is now certainly said, that the Hean wan Hairen is appointed for the Employy to Sweden. The ^bcates of Zealand continue their difficulties in the matter of the French Wines, Gr. fo that it is much doubted, whether that affair may arrive to any perfection this Selfion of the States of Holland.

Chefter, October 2. Yetlerday was folemnly Confectared in the Quire of our Cathedral Church, the Right Reverend Father in God, Doctor Henry Bridgeman, (late Dean of this place) Bilhop of Soder and Man; The Ceremony being petformed by the Right Reverend Father in God, the Lord Bilhop of this bee, as Sublimute of his Grace the Archbifhop of York, affilted by the Right Reverend Fathers in God, the Bilhop of Bangor, the Bilhop of Afapo, and Bilhop of Clonetar, in the prefence of many petfons of great quality, who were afterwards very nobly enterstained by the New Bilhop at his own House.

Cambradge, October 4. His Majefly this day Honored the University and Lown of Cambridge with His Royal Prefence, attended by many of the Nobilitysrom Newmarker; the Mayor and Aldermen with the Trayn Soldiers waited His coming without the Town; the whole Body of Students according to their feveral Orders and Degrees in their Habits, attended in the Streets from the first entrance unto the Schools; as He passed by the Market place, the Conduit ran with Claret Wine; at the Schools He was received by his Grace George Duke of Buckingham, Chancellor of the University, with the Vace-Chancellor and Doctors, prefented with a fur Bible, and a flort Speech made by the Orator; His Majesty viewed the Publick Library , took more efpecial notice of the rare Eastern M. S. given by his Grace George Duke of Buckingham, formerly Chancellor of the University ; as also of the many fair Volumes bought by the annual Beneficence of Tobias Ruftall Elquire, one of His Majelties prefent Servants; paffed from thence to Kings Colledge, heard an Anthem in the Chappel; from the top of the Leads had a fair prospect of the whole Town and Country; walked through the Streets to 8t. Fohn's Colledge and Trinity, where He viewed their Lis braries, and heard fort Speeches made by the Ma-Reroof both, as he had before done at Kings Colledge; after this he was entertained at Trinity Colledge with a Dinner, ferved up by Masters of Aits, being Regents, in their Habits, where plentiful Tables were spread also for the Nobility, and all others' belonging to the Court: After Dinner His Majefly conferred the Honor of Knighthood upon Charles Cæfar Efquire. (Son of Sir Henry Cæfar) who brought up the first dish ; and having seen a Comedy a fed there, with which His Majesty expressed himself to be well pleafed, as also with the good Order of the whole University, about five of the Clock He returned to Newmarket

Through His Majeflies great Favor, and his Grace the Chancellors care of the University, no Degrees were conferred upon any, by His Majeslies Command, though much defired by many.

Whitehall, Octo. 7. Our Letters from Dublin, tell us; of the lafe arrival of his Excellency the Lord Berkeley Lord Lieutenant of that Kingdom, together with all his Trayn, after a very crofs and tedious passage, to the great satisfaction of the people there.
