Stockholm, March 6, O. S.

ON the 4th Instant, the Diet being assembled in their several Chambers, the Nobles sent a Message to the other States, to communicate to them the three following Articles. 1. That the Nobles were of Opinion the Crown and Scepter and the other Regalia, which the Queen had kept in her Hands till now, should be removed into the Treasury of the Kingdom. 2. That the Nobles thought it very necessary a Deputation should be formed out of the Secret Committee, to consider of what is necessary for the Defence of the Kingdom. 3. The Nobles desired the Opinion of the other States as to the arresting a Member of the Diet, during the Diet's being assembled. The same Day, the three superiour Orders of the States confirmed the Form of Government, as it now stands, in all its Points. The Peasants have protested in general against the Proceedings of the Diet, unless they be admitted to a Part in the Secret Committee: The Nobility have been deliberating upon that Point, but are not yet come to any Resolution.

Turin, March 24, N. S. Madame Royale having been for some Days confined to her Bed by Indisposition, began on the 20th Instant to sit up in her Chamber; but she is still very weak, and so much decayed, that there is but little Hope of her Recovery. On the 21st the Magistrates of the City and the Nobility of the Court, waited on their Majesties and the Prince, to make their Compliments of Condolence on the Death of the Princess, since which their Majesties and the Prince appear daily in publick at Court.

Paris, March 31, N. S. Count Rotembourg is named one of the most Christian King's Plenipotentiaries for the Congress at Cambray, in the Room of Count Morville lately made Secretary of State. The King continues his Residence at Versailles, whither the Duke of Orleans and the Duke de Chartres went from hence the 1st Instant. The Cardinal du Bois first Minister, has been indisposed, but is now pretty well recovered. A Promotion of Knights of the Holy Ghost will be made in a few Days, the King having ordered a Chapter of that Order to be summoned.

Madrid, March 22, N. S. By Letters from Cadiz and Malaga we have an Account, that large Stores of Provisions and Ammunition are providing there, for the Service of a considerable Body of Troops which is to be transported to Ceuta, in order to dislodge the Moorish Army which has lately been reinforced before that Place, and to demolish all the Intrenchments and other Works which they have made for carrying on that Siege. The Importation of French Linnens into this Kingdom, being still prohibited, the Flota which is intended to be dispatched about the End of April for

New-Spain, will be obliged to take in the Linnens that come from Holland and Ham-bourg, which are therefore already much risen in Price.
