E R Royal Highnels the Princels of Wales lying in at the Time of Her Birth Day the 1ft of March, the Celebration of that Day at Court was then put off, and is appointed to be To-morrow the 3d loftant.

Cadiz, March 16, N. S. Preparations are making here for transporting to Ceuta a con fiderable Body of Troops, with a Train of Artillery and Stores, to astack the Moors who beliege that Place, and to make new Works for the Defence of the Spanish Garri fon. These Forces are to be transported in Saitias and other small Boats, for there are no Ships hired for this Service. The Want of Rain in these Parts gives us Apprehensions of a bad Harvest: Corn is very scarce and dear all along this Coast of Andalousia.

Lisbon, March 18, N.S. On the 11th Instant the Fleet from the Rio de Janeiro, confifting of 15 Merchant Ships, under the Con-voy of two Men of War, arrived in this Harbour. Their Cargoes are principally Su-gar, Hides, and Elephants Teeth, besides Gold, which appears by the Register to a-mount to the Value of Eight Millions of Crufado's, or One Million Sterling ; of which two hundred and nine thousand Pounds are for the King of Portugal, and the Remainder is on the Account of private Persons. There are befides on Board, two hundred and fifty thoufand Pieces of Eight, and a confiderable Quan-tity of unregistred Gold. The British Men of War now in this Port are the Colchefter, the Leopard, the Falmouth, and the Lime Gal-ley. The last Letters from Malaga advise, ley. that befides the Troops and Ammunition already fent to Ceuta, which is very closely be fieged by the Moors, the Spaniards intend to form an Army to be lent over into Africa, for the Relief of that Place; and for that Purpole were making Preparations in the Neighbourhood of Malaga, for Quarter-ing the Troops defigned for that Expedi-tion, in which it was thought they would meet with great Difficulties, there being a very great Scarcity of Corn in those Parts.

Pifa, March 24, N. S. The Quarantain between Leghorn and Genoa is taken off, which will very much facilitate Commerce on the Coaft of Italy, particularly with relation to British Ships. Three of the Great Duke's Gallies are preparing to put to Sex next Month, and Captain Ricci is gone to Leghorn, to provide all the neceffary Stores for that purpole. It is not yet known whether they will go directly to Malta, or whether they are only defigned to cruife, to protect our Coafts from the Corfairs of Barbary.

The Count de St. Eftevan Ambaffadour Penipotentiary of the King of Spain, arrived here on the 31ft paft, and is to return to Cambray as foon as he has made the King his Mafter's Compliments to his most Christian Majesty on his Coronation and Majority; for which purpose he expects an Audience in a Day or two.
