And by a new Regulation his Majesty has settled, that none shall be admitted hereaster into that Order of Knighthood, but fuch as have served as Collonel 13 Years, or as Captain 20, or as an inferiour Officer 25. On the 15th in the Morning the Duke of Orleans passed through this City to go to Chelles to see the Princels his Daughter, returned that Night to the Palais Royal, and Yesterday went back to Versailles. Duke du Maine had Admittance to the King on the 15th, and was received very graciously: That Duke with his Family 18 now allowed to refide at Versailles as formerly. Yefterday the Duke de Grammont took a Review of the Regiment of French Guards of which he is Collonel: On the 19th Instant the Regiment of Swis Guards is to be reviewed by the Duke du Maine: And next Week both thule Regiments are to pals in Review before the King at Versailles.
