Letters from Vienna of the 10th Instant relate, that Count Schlick Great Chancellour of Bohemia, died of an Apoplexy the 8th, in his 60th Year. It is advised from Copenhagen the 17th Instant, that eight Danish Men of War of the Line had put out of that Harbour, and were to be followed by three others in a few Days.
