Hambourg, April 20, N. S.

WE have received Letters from Muscovy dated the 19th of last Month, which advise, that the Capighi Bashi who came from the Ottoman Port on a Message to the Czar, having staid some Days at Moscow after he had received that Prince's Answer, was set out from thence on his Return to Constantinople. The Duke of Holstein had also left Moscow to follow the Czar to Petersbourg, where the two Princes of Hesse-Hombourg are arrived: It was rumoured the Czar designed to give one of the Princesses his Daughters in Marriage to one of those Princes, and his Niece the Dutchess of Courland to the other. His Czarian Majesty has given to Prince Dolhorucky, formerly his Ambassadour at the Court of France, the Palace of Baron Schaffinof at Petersbourg; it was not yet known who would succeed that Baron in the Employment of Vice-Chancellour, but it was the general Expectation it would be M. Osterman. It is advised from Petersbourg, that serviceable Seamen were much wanted for the Men of War the Czar had ordered to be fitted out there. Those of the Officers and Seamen who are Foreigners, were desirous to quit the Czar's Service, because they are not paid regularly and were also dissatisfied on other Accounts; but his Czarish Majesty had caused Proclamations to be published, forbidding rigorously the suffering any Person to go out of his Dominions without a Passport signed with his own Hand.

Paris, April 21, N. S. The Duke and Dutchess du Maine having taken Possessi-

on of their Apartments allowed them at Versailles, a great Number of Persons of Quality have been to make their Visits to them; and it is reported the Care of the Education of the Infanta Queen will be committed to that Dutchess. The King being desirous to pass some Part of the Summer at Meudon, Preparations are making for his going thither the Beginning of July. The Chevalier d'Orleans Grand Prior of France, Grandee of Spain of the First Rank, is returned hither from the Court of Madrid. The Review of the Regiments of French and Swiss Guards by the King, is put off to the 26th Instant, when they are to be drawn up before the great Gate of Versailles. The Inspectors of the rest of the King's Troops are ordered to make their respective Reviews and Musters in July.

Hague, April 23. On the 20th Instant the States of the Province of Holland who had been some Time assembled here, separated, and are to meet again in May next. Letters from Vienna of the 10th Instant relate, that Count Schlick Great Chancellour of Bohemia, died of an Apoplexy the 8th, in his 60th Year. It is advised from Copenhagen the 17th Instant, that eight Danish Men of War of the Line had put out of that Harbour, and were to be followed by three others in a few Days.
