AN humble Address of the High Sheriff, Grand-Jury, Justices of the Peace, Gentlemen, and Clergy, assembled at the Assizes held for the County of York the 18th Day of March, 1722. has been presented to His Majesty by the Right Honourable William Pulteney, Esq; Lieutenant of the East-Riding of the said County.

Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Stockholm March 27, O. S. Yesterday the States assembled, after several Days Intermission; when the Committee for regulating the Pretensions of the several Officers returned out of Muscovy made their Report, which contained a Scheme for replacing those Officers among the Troops now on Foot. This Day the Officers in Post have protested against that Scheme, alledging it to be directly contrary to the present settled Form of Government, and the Dispositions made in 1719, and the two following Years.

Madrid, April 12, N. S. The 31st of last Month being the Day on which the Infanta Queen of France entered into the 6th Year of her Age, there was a great Appearance at Court of the Grandees and Foreign Ministers, who made their Compliments on that Occasion to their Catholick Majesties, and had the Honour to kiss their Hands. That Evening the King and Queen, with the Prince of Asturias, went to Aranjuez, whither the Princess of Asturias and the Infantes were gone before; and it is thought the Court will pass the rest of the Spring there. It is advised from Cadiz, that Orders were come thither for fitting out four Men of War, to be added to the Squadron which is to be commanded by the Marquess Mari, and to be employed this Summer in the Mediterranean: And that the Flota for New Spain will not be ready to put to Sea before the End of June. The Dutchess Dowager of Ossuna has had a Law-Suit with the Count de Pennaranda for the Marquise of Berlanga of considerable Value, determined in her Favour by the Council of Castile, from which there lies no Appeal.

Paris, April 24, N. S. On the 22d in the Afternoon the Duke of Orleans came to the Palais Royal, and Yesterday in the Evening went to Versailles. Next Monday the French and Swiss Guards are to pass in Review before the King at Versailles, when the Duke du Maine and the Prince of Dombes will be at the Head of the Swiss. To morrow the Abbot Begon is to be consecrated Bishop of Toul, by the Cardinal de Rohan assisted by two Bishops.

Whitehall, April 19, 1723.

For the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Robbery, His Majesty is graciously pleased to promise to any Person or Persons who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be apprehended, the Persons concerned in the said Robbery, or any one or more of them, a Reward of 50 l. to be paid by the Receiver General of His Majesty's Customs, for each of them so discovered and apprehended, so as he or they may be secured and brought to Justice: And His Majesty is likewise pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any Person concerned in the same, who shall discover his Accomplices in the said Robbery, so as that they may be apprehended and proceeded against according to Law.
