Turin, April 28, N. S.

HIS Sardinian Majesty has ordered a Detachment to be made of seven Men out of every Troop of Horse and Dragoons, to be transported forthwith to Sardinia, for relieving the like Number of Men who are recalled from that Island. Yesterday being the Prince of Piemont's Birthday, his Majesty and his Royal Highness went to the Venetia, to avoid the usual Ceremonies, to the end the Mourning for the Death of the Prince's might not be discontinued. Madame Royale is entirely recovered of her late Indisposition.

Paris, May 5. The King's Declaration for re-establishing the Duke du Maine in his Honour and Privileges, was registred Yesterday in Parliament; M. de Mesmes first President, though he has been for some time indisposed, going thither for that Purpose. The Cardinal du Bois, first Minister, is to be present at the Opening of the Assembly of the Clergy, on the 25th Instant, to acquaint them with his most Christian Majesty's Intentions in convening them. The Marquis de Beringhen, Knight of the Order of the Holy Ghost, Master of the Horse to the King, Governour of the Citadels of Marsailles, Inspector General of the Bridges and Roads of France, died here on the 1st Instant: He is succeeded as Master of the Horse, and in his said Government at Marsailles, by his eldest Son who had the Reversion of those two Employments. That of Inspector-General of the Bridges and Roads is given to M. du Bois, the King's private Secretary, Brother of the Cardinal of that Name.

Lisbon, April 14, N. S. The last Letters from Cadiz advise, that the nine Spanish Men of War in that Harbour were careening, and that four of them were intended as a Convoy to the Flota which is to sail for Vera Cruz in July next. Those Letters add, that there was a great Scarcity of Corn throughout Spain, but more particularly in Andalusia. The Fleet design'd for Pernambuco, consisting of 16 Merchant Ships, under the Convoy of one Man of War, failed out of this Harbour this Morning; as did likewise two Men of War of 60 Guns, and a large Store-Ship for India. His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Leopard failed this Morning for the Downes; and Tomorrow the Lime Galley will proceed for Cadiz, and thence to Port Mahon. The Fajmouth, another British Man of War, continues still in this Harbour.
