N humble Address of the High Sheriff, Grand Jury, Justices of the Peace, and Freeholders of the County of Corke, affembled at a General Affize the 22d of March last; also an humble Address of the Mayor, Sheriffs, Recorder, Justices of the Peace, Aldermen, Grand Jury, Freemen, and other Inhabitants of the City of Corke, at a General Affize and Goal Delivery held for the faid City on the fame Day ; having been tranfmitted by the Lords Juffices of Jreland to his Grace the Duke of Grafton Lord Lieutenant of that Kingdom, have by him been prefented to His Majefty.

Which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very gracioully.

Madrid, May 1, N. S. It is advised from Andalufia, that having lately had Rain in those Parts, they have the Prospect now of a good Crop of Corn. The 24th Instant being the King's Birth-Day, the Grandees and other Persons of Diffinction went to Aranjuez, where the Court has refided for some Time, to make their Compliments to their Catholick Majesties; on which Occasion Mourning was laid aside: The Court is expected to re-turn hither in a few Days. The Franciscans having lately purchased the Liberty of a good Number of Captures, and brought them hi-ther from Algiers, they passed Vesterday in Proceedings the state of the s Procession before the Royal Palace, the Duke of Fernandina bearing the Standard before the Nobility who were invited to affift at the Proceffion. Letters from Cadiz give an Ac-count, that the Intendant Patino had given publick Notice for all the Ships which are allowed to form the Flota for New-Spain, to be ready to take in their Lading the Beginning of this Month; on the Penalty to fuch as should not then be in Readines, of having their Licences taken from them. A French Veffel which was come into Cadiz from Martinico had brought an Account, that a Spanish Ship from Caracas named the Sea-Horse (which was given over for loft) had put into an Harbour of that Island. Don Balthasar de Guevara, who had the Care of the last Galleons, having waited on their Ca-tholick Majesties at Aranjuez a few Days ago, was very favourably received, and is to command that Flota which is defigned to be fitted out about the End of August next.

Turin, May 12, N.S. On the 5th Inftant in the Evening Madame Royale was taken very ill, which prevented his Sardinian Maje-fty's Departure for the Veneria. His Majefty bas ordered all his Troops to change their Garrifons: On the 8th General Deport's fecond Battallion and Count Saluce's Battallion, which were in Garrison in this Town, were relieved by the Regiment of Foot Guards, and one Battallion of Savoy, who are to remain here this Summer. On the 10th Inftant Madame

Royale being recovered, his Majefty let out for the Veneria; and in the Evening, her Majefty with the Duke D'Aouste, and the rest of the Court, went thither, in order to pals the Summer. The lame Day the Prince of Piedmont fet out for Pignerol, where he defigne to review his Regiment of Dragoons, and then to returo to the Veneria. The Marquels de Belljoyofo is arrived from Milan, with Orders from his Imperial Majefty, to congratulate the Prince of Piedmont upon the Birth of the young Prince, and at the same Time to con-dole with his Royal Highness upon the Death of the Princels.

Paris, May 19, N. S. The greateft Part of the Prelates and of the Deputies of the Clergy. from the feveral Provinces of the Kingdom, are arrived here, to affift at the Affembly of the Clergy which is to be opened here the 25th Inftant at the Grands Augusting. It is faid the Marquels d'Aligre, Lieutenant-General, will fhorily be created a Duke and Peer; which Honours are to descend to his Grandson the Marquels de Ropelmonde, who is then to take The on him the Name and Arms of Aligre, Infanta Queen, with the Ladies her Attendants, is to go next Month to refide at Meudon.
