N humble Address of the Lieutenant-Governour, Council, and Representa tives of His Majefty's Province of New-Hampshire in New-England, convened in General Affembly, has been presented to His Majefty by Mr. Newman Agent for that Province, being introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Carteret one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Which Address His Majesty was pleased to reerive very graciously.

Paris, May 29. On the 25th Inflant the Prelates and Deputies from the Provinces, who are to compose the General Affembly of the Clergy here, met at the House of the Archbishop of Aix their President, to settle the Form of opening their Affembly and proceeding to Bussines. Their first Session is to be on the 31st of this Month, in the Hall of the Grands Augustins, which is fitted up for this Occasion. In the mean time the Archbishop of Aix has frequent Conferences with the Cardinal' du Bois. M. de Campistron, one of the Forty of the French Academy, died fome Days ago at Toulousc. On the 27th M. de la Jonchere, one of the Paymasters-General of the French Forces, was taken into Custody by Virtue of a Lettre de Cachet from the King, and carried to the Bastile; at the fame time his Papers were feized. Yesterday died of an Apoplexy the Wise of the Marquels d'Aligre Lieutenant-General.

Hague, May 28. The States of the Province of Holland having re-affembled the 26th Inftant, have paffed a Refolution for paying the Debts of North Holland, and are taking up a Sum of Money at Intereft for that Purpofe. The Danifh Minister here having received Orders from his Court, to make new Instances to the States General, for the Arrears due to the King his Master, has prefented a Memorial on that Subject. The Bishop of Munster is come into this Country, and travels incognito by the Name of Count Hall ; he has been fome Days at Amsterdam, and is expected here this Evening. Prince William of Hesse Cassel arrived here

,

the 24th Inftant, and went to the Affembly of the States-General, to take the ufual Oath for his new Government of Maeffricht. He flays to pals a few Days here with the Bifhop of Munfter, and will then repair to his faid Government, Baron Friefheim, General of the Foot, Collonel of the Guards, and Governour of Heufden, is fo ill of a Fever, that 'tis thought he cannot recover ; he is in the 84th Year of his Age.
