THEIR Catholick Majesties continue at Balsain, whither the Duke of Atri has obtained Leave to go to return the King Thanks for conferring on him the Command of a Company in the Italian Guards. Don Carlos Grillo, Lieutenant General in the Marine Service, is nominated to command the Squadron of Galleons which are to go this Year to Cartagena and Portobelo, and to Day publick Notice was given that the King has resolved those Galleons shall put to Sea before the End of August. The Duke of Liria being returned hither from Paris, has applied to the Marquess de Grimaldo, Secretary of State, for Leave to wait on their Catholick Majesties at Balsain. Letters from Cadiz advise, that on the 6th Instant the Intendant Sig. Patino gave publick Notice there, that after the 8th no more Goods should be put on board the Flota fitting out there for New-Spain; which will consist only of three Men of War, four Merchant-Ships, and three Register-Ships for Honduras, Campechy and Maracaybo.

Hanover, June 14, O. S. His Majesty arrived here in good Health last Tuesday the 11th Instant in the Evening. The Lords Townshend and Carteret are expected here to Night.

Edinburgh, June 13. This Day the Peers of Scotland met at Holy-Rood-House, for choosing a Peer to sit in the Parliament of Great Britain in the Room of the late James Earl of Bute, and the Right Honourable John Earl of Rothes was unanimously elected.
