BREAD STREET, CHEAPSIDE, EAST POULTRY AVENUE AND POULTRY

THE CITY OF LONDON (LOADING BAYS) (GOODS VEHICLES) (SMITHFIELD) (NO. 5) ORDER 2016

THE CITY OF LONDON (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (AMENDMENT NO. 19) ORDER 2016

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Common Council of the City of London, on 17 October 2016 made the above Orders under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

2. The effect of the Orders will be in:-

(a) **Bread Street** to extend the existing 'at any time' waiting restrictions southward to the junction with Cannon Street;

(b) **Cheapside** to introduce 'at any time' loading restrictions on the south side outside the Tesco Metro;

(c) **East Poultry Avenue** to:-

(A) divide the existing loading bays and reduce the overall length of loading bay provision; and

(B) introduce 'at any time' loading restrictions around the build outs; and

(d) **Poultry** to introduce 'at any time' loading restrictions on the south side outside No.1.

3. The proposal published on 7 September 2016 to introduce loading restrictions operating 'between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive' on the south side outside Nos. 32 and 34 Threadneedle Street is withdrawn.

4. Copies of the proposed Orders, which will come into operation on 24 October 2016, of the statement of reasons for making the Orders and of plans showing the affected streets can be inspected during normal office hours on Monday to Fridays inclusive for a period of six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made at the Planning Enquiry Desk, North Wing, Guildhall, London, EC2P 2EJ.

5. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Westminster City Council proposes to make the following Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended.
