Plymouth, October 15.

Efterday arrived here the two Brothers of London, bound for Port Mahon, together with the Sufan and the Hopewell Endcavor of the fame Port, the former bound for Lisbonne, and the other for Tangier. Here are at prefent in Port many other Ships bound for feveral parts abroad.

Madrid, Sept. 30. It is now certainly faid, that the Marquis de Liche, is appointed by the Queen Reg-nt to go Ambaflador to the Court of Rome, in the place of the Marquis d^{*} Aftorgas, who is removed from thence to the Government of Naples. The 17 inftant being the Anniverfary of the late King Philip the fourth, was Celebrated here in the Kings Chappel with much Solemnity. The Galleys of Naples arrived at Barcellona from Cartagenz.had, as we are told, taken a Turkih Veffel, on which was 50 Moors in their way thither. Here is fome days fince arrived the Duke de Medina Celi. The young King is at prefent perfectly well again, to the infinite 'joy of this Court.

Vienni, Octob. 4. The news continues here of the diffurbance near Mecca being appealed, infomuch, that there be thole who begin in fome manner to credit it, however, whilf we cannot fee any fufficient grounds for the truth of it, we may more juftly believe this report to have been raifed by the Rebels of Hungary, as well to keep their party in heart, as in fome measure to perplex this Court; the Emperor hath refolved to raife more Men, and to that end a great many firange Officers are at prefent at Ebersdorft, where the Court now is expecting Commiffions.

The affairs of *Cologne* occasions much discourse here, the general opinion according to our advices from those parts, being that that place will be attacked this winter.

Ratisbonne, Octob. 8. The Bifhop of Aichftadt, Commiffioner General for his Imperial Majefty at this Dyet, being returned to his Palace in this place, with intentions to continue ther the whole winter, feems now with more earneftnefs to prefs this Dyet to a conclution of the Treaty touching the publick fecurity, and perpetual Capitulation; which though much laboured at, meets ftill with fo many difficalties, as to hinder any fetled refolution The Dyet have refolved on the fatisfying the Duke of Lorraine, upon the Evacuation of Homburgh.

i Francfort, Oftob. 9. Our Magistrates here having been informed of Everal loose perfons who pass to and fro in these Countries, under pretence of selling small wares, and carry about them several poylotous Ointments, by which they infect the perfons they traffick with, infomuch, that many have dyed thereof, as hath appeared by the confession of some lately apprehended upon that score in Bavaria, have by an Edict given warning thereof to all the Inhabitants of this place, strictly charging all their Offiters, well to examine all Strangers and Passers, and not to suffer them to come into the place, except they have a Pass to that purpose, or can give a very good account of themselves.

Hamburgh, Octob. 12. The Bishop of Munster continues his Fortifications at Dorsten, with all the vigor imaginable, as also to raile men, as are likewise the Dukes of Lunenburgh. Several Expresses have lately passed this place towards Sweden from France.

Venice, Octob.9. On Wednesday laft this Duke and Senate went in folemn Proceffion (as is here yearly accuftomed on that day, in memorial of a fignal Victory obtained againft the Turks at Sea, by the Fleet of this Republick) attended by all the Nobility, as alfo the feveral Religious Orders of this place, *a*mongft which, the Jefuits likewife appeared, according to the Order of the Colledge 5 athing which was at firft much oppofed by thofe Fathers, who alleadged their Priviledges, and feveral-Bulls from the Pope, exempting them from attending on fuch occafions, and which it is thought, they would with fome trouble have fubmitted to, had they not lately received exprefs Orders from the Court of *Rome* fo to do.

Our Letters from the Port bring us the confirmation of the death of the Bailo de Molino, Ambaffador there on the part of this State; by the fame Letters we are farther aflured, of the continuance of the Rebellion in the Ottoman Territories near Mecca, and that the Grand Signiors Forces are marching that way with all poffible fpeed; though there be fome in the mean time, who would look upon this noife of a revolt, to be a Contrivance of the Grand Signior, to amufe his Neighbours, againft whom he may with more advantage (whilft they feem fecure, by reafon of this diffurbance in his own Dominions, and therefore not fo well provided) return with all his Forces towards Spring.

From Spalatro we have advice from Procurator Nani, that the Grand Signior had appointed an other Plenipotentiaty, to repair with all fpeed into those parts, f t the final determining the matter of the Limits, and tha he might not lose any time, which fremed necesf. ry for the providing his equipage for that emp oyment, had given him all the goods and moveables of the late Basa of Bossina in Dalmatia, fo that he was by that mears enabled to begin his journey very fuddainly thither. Signior Andrea Vallier Governor of Zant, &c. may depart in few day, towards those parts, here lying two Galleys ready, which attend him in order to his paffage thither

The Dukehath been of late indifpofed, but is at prefent fomewhat better in the Country, whither he is gone to take the Aire for fome time. At the inflance of the French Ambaflador, this Senate hath given order for the releafing all the French Slavés at prefent in their Galleys, upon reimburfment of the Moneys which was paid at first for them. We shall have here this winter great numbers of Strangers, and those of the most eminent quality, as well from *Rome as Germany*, and other parts.

The Dukes of Brunswicke are dayly expected here, as also the Constable of Colonna, &c. We hear nothing farther of the rencounter between the Maltha Galleys and part of the Turkish Fleet, in which ir was faid, the former had obtained fo great advantage. From Rome they write, that his most Chli-Atian Majesty had desired a Cardinals Cap for the Archb shop of Tholouse.

Cologne, Octob. 16. Our Elector continues his Leavies with much vigor; it is faid, that the French Forces in Lorraine encrease dayly, which occasions much difcourfe in all these parts of a War next Spring; in the mean time we are not without promifes of a powerful affiltance, in case things come to far. Our Elector continues to buy up valt quantities of Corne and other Graines.

From Wescl we hear of two Vessels coming from Holland with Ammunition that have been stopped there. The Count of Conningsmark hath compleated tome of his Troops, which are to be quartered this winter in the Territories of our Elector.

Bruffels, Octob. 18. Here is lately dead the Bifhop of Iper; on Saturday laft paffed through this place the Sieur Canon; on his way from Paris, where he had been on the part of the Duke of Lorraine, to follicite his affairs at that Court, though as we are informed, with as little fuccefs as formerly, infomuch, that the hopes of an accommodation between his molt Christian Majesty and that Duke begin wholly to leave us.

The Chapter of *Liege* is much diffatisfied at fome French Forces being ordered to quarter in those Countries, and, have fent to represent to their Elector that these his orders are contrary to the Neutrality they always have, and would fill observe towards their Neighbours.

Our advices from Cologne, fpeak now of nothing but of the great appearance of, and preparations for War; That the Treaty between them and their Elector is still with much difficulty kept on foot, nor can it be hoped, but that it will suddenly be proken off, and perhaps in anger; however, they feem to promise themselves in case of a rupture, the affiltance of the Emperor, \mathfrak{Se} .

We are told of Letters lately arrived from Spaine, which not onely speak of 5000 Men that are raising there for the fervice of these Provinces, but that we shall have from thence a Fleet of 20 men of War to guard our Goalts against Spring.

That the States of Holland feemed refolved to fuccor Cologne, in cafe that place was attacked, and were fending to the States of Zealand, to difpole them to a Concurrence with them in that refolution. . Hague, Octob. 18. Yefferday arrived here the young Prince of Naffam from Friefland, to fetch the Krincels his Mother, who hath been fome time here to wift the Princels Dowages of Orange hur Mothers on the Baths in Germanny, and to accompany her back rowards Friefland, whither they may accordingly depart is fome days; that Princels having given order for the preparing all things for her fourgey.

On Friday laft the Heer van Gioe the Danish Miniffer a returned bither from Amfterdam , rogether

with the Count de Rantfau, Ambassador from that Crown to his most Christian Majesty. We are told of an order which is about publishing, by which all Governors and other Commanders in chief, are strictly charged to keep their Garrisons compleat, and not to duffer either Officers or Soldiers to stir out of them, unless upon urgent occasions.

The States of Holland before their last parting, had resolved to fend with all speed an Envoy to the Elector of Brande. burgh, and acordingly proposed the same to the States General, who having agreed thereunto, are about making choice of a perion for that employment. At Cleve; the States of those Countries are still assembled, having made very confiderable progress-in the matter of the Subsidies, as likewise in what relates to the raising af men, defired by that Elector, as a thing altogether necessary ry in the present conjuncture.

From Maestricht they write, that there was a report, as if fome French Troops were to come and lodge in Gulich this winter, and of other Troops which the Elector of Cologne and Bishop of Munifer are bringing together; but whilft our advices from the Frontiers are fomewhat incertain; we know not what credit to give to these. His Highness the Prince of Orange is expected here towards the latter end of this week. The Yelt-Marshal Wurts is ftill here.

Hague, Oftob. 23. The Heer Ruart van Putten. and the Heer Vander Meer are lately gone hence by order of the States, towards the Quarters on the Rhyne, to inform themselves of the State of those places, and to regulate what they may find amils there.

Here are at prefent in Town feveral Officers from the Frontiers, to receive the farther Orders of the States relating to their respective Commands. Yeflerday the Heer van Haren, deligned Ambassader to the Grownes of Smeden and Danemark, arrived here from Friefland; in the mean time his instructions and dispatches are drawing up, to the end he may he able to let forward on that Embassy forthwith.

From Over Iffel they write, that there were arriyed feveral pattengers at Swol, having patted Munfler and Coesfelr, who allore them that that Bifhop is raifing men apace, for the affiltance as is there faid, of fome other Prince. On Tuesday laft the Heer win Odyk, went hence for Zealand, where the States of that Province are to meet again in few days, in order to the concluding fome matters which they left unfinished at their laft Seffion.

The Heer van Werchendam, and the Heer van Verburgh, are deputed by the States General at the States of Zealand, to prefs them to a determination of the matter concerning the French Wines, Gr. as likewife to confer with them, as is thought, concerning the affairs of Cologne. The Landsgrave of Heffen is at prefent here.

Amfterdam, Oflober 23. From the Yexel they well us, that the Ship's defigned for the Eaft Indies, lye ready there to lay l with the first fair wind; as likewife an other Fleet of Merchant men, bound for the Streights, Gr. that there were arrived fix Ships from France.
