N the 3d Inftant the King appointed the Duke of San Pedro to be Gover-nour of the Infante Don Carlos; and Don Francisco de Aguerre, one of the Queen's Majordomos, and Nephew of the Corregidor the Marquese de Vadillo, to be his Sub-Governoor. His Majefty has fettled a Penfion of 2000 Ducats a Year on the Marchionels of Monte-hermolo, Sifter of the Marquels de Vadillo, with Leave to remain in the Palace as one of the Ladies of Honour; in token of his Satisfaction with her Care in educating the Infante till he had compleated the 7th Year of his Age, when he was taken from the Tuition of Women. On the 6th died here his Catholick Majesty's Confession, Father Daubenton, in the 82d Year of his Age. On the 7th his Body was interred in the Church of the Noviciates of the Jeluits; most of the Grandees, with Cardinal Belluga, the Arch-bishop of Toledo, and many other Persons of Diffinction, voluntarily and without Invitation, affifting at his Funeral, to fhew their Regard to his Memory. His Majesty has named for his Successour in that Office, Father Gabriel Bermudez, a Spaniard. On the 18th their Catholick Majefties will remove from Balfain to the Elcurial, that Day being fixed for the Confummation of the Prince of Afturias's Marriage.

Lisbon, Aug. 11, N. S. The Moors still continue in these Seas, to the great Dif-turbance of the French and Dutch Trade. On the 22d past they took a Dutch Dogger called the Young Lawrence, with Salt from Cadia for Amfterdam, on the Coaft of Algarve : The Men found Means to escape, but the Mafter was made their Captive. On the 4th Inftant His Britannick Majefty's Ship the Durfley, Captain Purvis Commander, failed from this Harbour for Cadiz.

Hanover, Aug. 24, N. S. M. le Coq his Polifh Majefty's Envoy Extraordinary at this Court, returned hither on the 21ft Inftant from Drefden ; as did alfo M. Walleurodt the Pruffian Minister from Berlin, whither he attended the Queen of Pruffia. Yesterday Me. Scot fet out from this Place to return to Berlin. Mr. Southwell, Secretary of State for Ireland, arrived here on Sunday Night, with his Son: They were Yefterday introduced to the King by the Lord Vifcount Townshend, and had the Honour to kile His Majefty's Hand. Ye-Acrea Morning early His Majefty went leve-ral Miles from hence to divert himfelf with Shooting, and did not return till Four in these Afternoon. He was attended by the Lord Carteret, and other Perfons of Quality. Or-ders are fent to fix Regiments of Foot, and five of Horfe and Dragoons, to be in a Readinels to march from their respective Quarters into the Neighbourhood of this Place; His Majefty intending to review thole Troops about the Middle of next Month. Copenhagen, Aug. 17, N.S. Major General Lewenorn let out from hence this Day for Hanover, to make the King of Denmark's Compliments to His Britannick Majefty. M. Bestuchef, the Muscovite Minister who returned hither the 3d Inftant from the Czar, has fince had an Audience of the Kirg, in which he faid he was very much furprized to find at his Return hither more Ships of War fitted out than when he went from hence ; and affured his Majefty he needed not have any Apprehensions of the Czar.

Hambourg, Aug. 20, N.S. Our Advices from Petersbourg of the 30th paft, tell us, that fome Part of the Czar's Fleet was returned to Cronflot, leaving the other Ships at Revel. The Czar himfelf was gone to Roger-wick, a Place fituate between Revel and Narvel. va, where he intends to make a new Port. From thence the Czar defigned to return to Revel, and then proceed to Riga.
