Stockholm, August 7, O. S.

LAST Week the Nobles deliberated upon the Sentence which has been pronounced on M. Daleen and Brotzenius. There were some who proposed that the Sentence might be mitigated; but the Major Part maintained, that a Sentence given by a Commission of all the States of the Kingdom, and approved of by the States, ought to remain firm. That Matter is not yet quite finished, but in all Appearance the Sentence of the Commission will be executed according to its Tenour. The States were this Day assembled, and have determined finally to elect but two Senators. The Nobility have constituted 12 Electors, who are obliged upon Oath to chuse other 50 Electors which they shall judge most proper for the Nomination of the two Senators to be elected. The 50 will be chosen To-morrow or next Day; and it is generally thought the two new Senators will be, the Marshal of the Diet Baron Lagerberg, and Governour Conrad Ribbing.

Hanover, Aug. 31, N. S. M. Lewenorn, Minister from the King of Denmark, arrived here on Saturday last, and on Sunday he had an Audience of His Majesty, being introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Townshend. Baron Sparre, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sweden, who designed to have gone forthwith from hence to Stockholm, was obliged to alter his Resolution by Reason of a sudden Indisposition, and set out on Saturday last, by Advice of Physicians, to return to England in order to make use of the Bath or Bristol Waters for recovering his Health.
