O the Intent that no Perfon may through Ignorance of the Law or Inadvertency omit complying with the Directions of the Act herein after fet forth, and incur the Penalties thereby inflicted, it is thought proper to infert the fame at large in this Gazette; and all 'Perfons whatfoever, both Men and Women, in England, Scotland, Wales, and the Town of Berwick upon Tweed, refpectively, being of the Age of 18 or upwards, and not having taken the Oaths therein mentioned before the Firft Day of the laft Seffion of Parliament, are to take Notice that they are obliged to take the faid Oaths within the Time, and in fome of the Courts preferibed for that Purpofe, at their Peril, without any Sum mons or Notice for their fo doing, or in Default thereof to Register their Names and real Eftates in fuch Manner as the faid Act requires, under the Penalty of forfeiting all fuch real Eftate as they, or any Perfon or Perfons in Truft for them, fhall be feized of, or otherwife interefted in, at the Time when they ought to have made fuch Register.

An AE to oblige all Perfors, being Papisti, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and all Perfons in Great Britain, refusing or neglecting to take the Oaths appointed for the Security of His Majesty's Perfon and Government, by several AEts herein mentioned, to Register these Names and Real Estates.

"Hereas fince His Majefty's Happy Acceffion to the Crown of these Realms, divers Rebellions, Infurrections, and Traiterous Con-fpiracies have been entred into, and carried on, for the Deftruction of His Majesty's most facred Perfon and Government, the overturning our Re-ligious and Civil Rights, and for placing a Popith Pretender on the Throne : And whereas the Papifts, and other Perfons, refusing to take the Oaths appointed by Law to be taken to His Majefty, have enjoyed, and do ftill enjoy the Protection and Benefits of the Government, as well as the reft of His Majefty's Subjects, yet have been No-torioufly concerned in Contriving, Stirring up, and Supporting the faid Rebellion, Infurrections, and Confpiracies, by which it most manifestly appears, that they take themfelves to be obliged, by the Principles they profes, to be Enemies to His Majefty and the prefent Happy Eftablishment; and forafmuch as it is highly reasonable, that the Government should be throughly acquainted with, and apprized of the Number, Names, and Real Eftates of fuch difaffected Perfons, as aforefaid, in order more effectually to prevent, difappoint or punish the like Traiterous Attempts for the future, in fuch Manner, as by the Wildom of Parliament shall hereafter be thought proper; Be it therefore Enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That all and every Perfon and Perfons whatfoever, inhabiting in that Part of Great Britain called England, Wales, or Town of Berwick upon Tweed, who fhall be at the Age of Eighteen Years or upward, not having already taken the Oaths appointed to be taken in and by an A& made in the First Year of His Majesty's Reign, [Intituled, An A# for the further Security of His Majesty's Person and Government, and the Succes-

being Protestants, and for extinguishing the Hopes of the pretended Prince of Wales, and his open and Jecres Apretended Prince of Wales, and his open and fecret A-bettors;] and who shall neglect or refuse to take the faid Oaths on or before the Twenty fifth Day of December, One thousand feven hundred and twenty three, in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at Westminster, or at the General or Quarter-Sessions for the County, City, Town, Liberty, or Division, where such Person or Per-fons shall live or inhabit, all and every such Per-fon or Perfons, who shall neglect or testile to take the faid Oaths by the Time aforesaid, shall, on or before the Twenty fifth Day of March. And it is hereby further Fnacted, That every Acticle, Claufe, and Thing, in the faid laft mentioned Acts contained, relating to the Regiftring of the Names and Real Effaces of Papifts, or to receiving or taking the faid Regifters, and the examining upon Oath, or otherwife, into the Truth and Reality of the fame, fhall extend and be conftrued to extend to all and every the Regifters required and directed to be made and received, by and in purfuance of this Act, in as full and ample Manner, as if the fame were herein again particularly recited and enacted.
