

## Whitehall, July 26.

O the Intent that no Perfon may through Ignorance of the Law or Inadvertency omit complying with the Directions of the Act herein after fet forth, and incur the Penalties thereby inflicted, it is thought proper to infert the fame at large in this Gazette; and all Perfons whatfoever, both Men and Women, in England, Scotland, Wales, and the Town of Berwick upon Tweed, refpectively, being of the Age of 18 or upwards, and not having taken the Oaths therein mentioned before the Firft Day of the laft Seflion of Parliament, are to take Notice that they are obliged to take the faid Oaths within the Time, and in fome of the Courts preferibed for that Purpofe, at. their Peril, without any Summons or Notice for their fo doing, or in Default thereof to Regifter their Names and real Effates in fuch Manner as the faid Act requires, under the Penalty of forfeiting all fuch real Effate as they, or any Perfon or Perfons in Truft for them, fhall be feized of, or otherwife interefted in, at the Time when they ought to have made fuch Regifter.

## Anno Nono Georgii Regis:

An Alt to oblige all Perfuss, being Papifit, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and all Perfons in Great Britain, refufing or negletting to take the Oaths appointed for the Security of His Majefit's Perfon and Government, by feveral Alts herein thentioned, to Regular their Names and Real Effaces.

W Hereas fince His Majefty's Happy Acceffion to the Crown of thefe Realms, divers Rebellions, Infurrections, and Traiterous Confpiracies have been entred into, and carried on, for the Deftruction of His Majefty's moft facred Perfon and Government, the overturning our Religious and Civil Rights, and for placing a Popith Pretender on the Throne : And whereas the Papifts, and other Perfons, refuling to take the Oaths appointed by Law to be taken to His Majefty, have enjoyed, and do ftill enjoy the Protection and Benefits of the Government, as well as the reft of His Majefty's Subjects, yet have been Notorioufly concerned in Contriving, Stirring up, and Supporting the faid Rebellions, Infurrections, and Confpiracies, by which it moft manifeftly appears, that they take themfelves to be obliged, by

the Principles they profess, to be Enemies to His Majefty and the present Happy Establishment ; and forafmuch as it is highly reasonable, that the Government should be throughly acquainted with, and apprized of the Number, Names, and Real Effates of fuch difaffected Perfons, as aforefaid, in order more effectually to prevent, difapa point or punish the like Traiterous Attempts for the future, in fuch Manner, as by the Wildom of Parliament fail hereafter be thought proper ; Be it therefore Enacted by the King's molt Excellent Majefty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons in this prefent Parliament allembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That all and every Perion Authority of the 1sme, That all and every Parlon and Perfons whatfoever, inhabiting in that Part of Great Britain called England, Wales, or Town of Berwick upon Tweed, who fhall be at the Age of Eighteen Years or upward, not having alre dy taken the Oaths appointed to be taken in and by an A& made in the First Year of His Majefty's Reign, [Intituled, An Aff for the further Security's of His Majefty's Perfon and Government, and the Suttef-fion of the Crown in the Heirsof the late Prince's Sophila heing Proteflastic and for estimations the Hopes of the being Protestants, and for extinguishing the Hopes of the pretended Prince of Wales, and his open and ficret Apretensed Printe of Wales, and his open and ficret A-bestors; ] and who shall negled or refuse to take the faid Oaths on or before the Twenty fifth Day of December, One thousand feven hundred and twenty three, in any of His Majesty's Courds of Record at Westminster, or at the General or Quarter-Sessions for the County, City, Town, Liberty, or Division, where such Perfon or Per-fons shall live or inhabit, all and every such Per-fon or Perfons, who shall newleft or result to fon or Perfons, who shall neglect or refuse to take the faid Oaths by the Time aforefaid, shall, on or before the Twenty fifth Day of March, One thousand feven hundred and twenty four, Regifter, or caufe to be Registred, their refpective Names and Real Effates, in fuch and the fame Manner and Porm, as Papifts were obliged and directed to Register their Names and Real Effares, in and by an Act passed and real Estates, in and by an Act passed in the First Year of His Majesty's Reign [ Intituled, An AE to oblige Ps-piss' to Register their Names and Real Estates; ] and also by another Act made and passed in the Third Year of His faid Majesty's Reign, [Intituled, An AE for explaining an AE passed in the last Session of Parlia-ment, Intituled, An Act to oblige Papilits to Register their Names and Past Paster and for explaining their Names and Kear Diraces, and for fecuring the Time for fuch Registring, and for fecuring Purchates their Names and Real Effates, and for enlarging
