His week arrived here an other Courrier from the Court of Madrid, with farther instructions to the Marquis d'Astergas, relating to his Government of Naples, which the Queen Regent hath been pleased to bestow upon this Ambassador, who is not withstanding not to part from hence, till he shall have procured a Cardinals Cap for Father Nitard, formerly Confessor to that Queen, and Inquisitor General of Spaine, in favor of whom, her Majesty continues very zealous in her recommendations to his Holiness; in the interim we are told, that Don Pedro d' Arragon, present Vice-Roy of Naples, is not wanting to make use of his interest in this Court, in order to the promotion of the faid Father, as knowing he cannot do a more acceptable Service to the Queen his Mistress.

The Count de Prado, Ambailador herefrom the Crown of Portugal, being on his departure home, hath caused publick notice to be given thereof to all his Creditors here, for the fatisfying of whom, he hath lately had a very round fumme remitted to him from Portugal. His Holiness hath not as yet made choice of the person, that is to go Nuncio to the Court of
