NOTICE OF A DECISION ON AN APPLICATION FOR AN ORDER GRANTING DEVELOPMENT CONSENT

The Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy ("the Secretary of State") gives notice under regulation 23 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2009 that a determination has been made on an application by Wrexham Energy Limited ("the application") for an order granting development consent under the Planning Act 2008.

The application was for the construction and operation of a gas fired generation station with an installed capacity of up to 299MWe at Kingmoor Park South near Wrexham in Wales. It also included provision in the order for the compulsory acquisition and temporary possession of land for the gas connection alignment and related powers to facilitate development.

The Secretary of State has decided, following consideration of the report of the Examining Authority who conducted an examination into the application that development consent should be granted for the project, and therefore has decided to make an Order under sections 114, 115 and 120 of the Planning Act 2008.
