**L**AST Week the Order of Burghers sent a Committee to the House of the Nobles, with a Memorial wherein they represent, that whereas it was an established Rule before Sovereignty was introduced in the Time of King Charles XI, that the Members of all the Courts or Colleges should consist half of Nobility and half of Commoners, those Employments are now almost intirely engrossed by the Nobility, there being at present very few Commoners in any of the Courts, and in some none at all: Wherefore the Burghers demand, that an Act may now be made to divide all the Courts again as they were formerly into two Classes, half Nobles and half Commoners, and that all the Vacancies which may henceforward happen shall be filled with the latter, till such time as the Members become equal in every Court. This Memorial was received with Indignation by the Nobility, yet the Burghers were only told at the delivering it, that the House of the Nobles would consider of it, and send them an Answer in Writing as soon as possible. A Committee was accordingly appointed to draw it up with all Expedition; and on the 23d the said Committee laid the Answer they had prepared before the whole House, when it was unanimously approved: And Yesterday a Committee of 36 of the Nobility were sent, not only to carry that Answer to the Burghers, by which their Demand is rejected, but likewise to communicate the same to the Clergy and Peasants at their respective Houses.

*Gubne, Oct. 18, N. S.* The 13th Instant early in the Morning the King of Prussia went from Charlottenbourg to Potsdam, there to receive His Britannick Majesty, who took Leave the same Morning of the Queen and Royal Family at Charlottenbourg, and about Nine a Clock set out for Potsdam, near which Place his Prussian Majesty had ordered the Battalion of Great Grenadiers quartered there to be drawn up. They made a very fine Appearance, marched before their Majesties, and then drew up, and performed the Exercise of advancing and retreating and firing by Platoons, which they did with that Order and Dexterity that they fired above 10000 Shot in about 15 Minutes, each Man firing 14 times. Their Majesties proceeding to Potsdam, passed through several of the Streets to the Palace. After Dinner His Britannick Majesty took Chaife, and was accompanied a good Way out of Town by the King of Prussia with several of his General Officers on Horseback. His Britannick Majesty lay that Night at Fehrbellin, and the 14th came to this Place, having passed through Wusterhausen, Perleberg, and over the Elbe at the Ferry near Lentzen. His Majesty arrived here at Ten at Night, extremely satisfied with His Reception at Berlin, and in perfect good Health. On the 16th His Majesty, with Prince Frederick, and a great Number of the Court went out a Hunting. His Majesty was out again a Hunting To-Day.
