Their Excellencies the Lords Juffices in Council.

Their Excellencies the Lords Justices in Council, were this Day pleafed to order, That the Parliament which flands prorogued to Thurfday the 24th of this Inftant October, should be further prorogued to Tuesday the 19th Day of November next.

Lisbon, Sept. 28, N. S. On the 20th Infant the Victory, a Portuguele Man of War, of 60 Guns, which about three Mooths ago was lent upon a secret Expedition to the Cape de Verde, Islands, returned to this Pore. Four Days before the came in the met with three Algerines from 50 to 60 Guns each, and engaged them; butNight coming on they were parted, and met no more. The Expedition the faid Ship was fent upon was this, The British Vice Conful of Vigo, having been affured there by a Mulat-to, a Native of St. Antonio one of the Cape deVerde Islands, that he knew of a confiderable Treasure which had been buried in that Ifland by a Crew of Pyrates, being what they had taken on Board a Spanish Packet-Bost; the faid Vice-Conful with 13 English Mariners and the Mulatto, went in June last in a Sloop from Vigo to that Island, upon this Difcovery. This Court receiving Intelligence that they were gone with this Defign, difpatched the Man of War abovementioned, with Order to feize that Treasure for the King of Portugal, the Island of St. Antonio belonging to this Crowo. The Victory arriving at that Island, found the faid Vice-Conful and Mariners, whole Sloop had been driven on those there by a French Pyrate of 14 Guns. The Cap-

T the Council Chamber Whitehall, the 22d | tain of the Portuguele Man of War foon after his Arrival at the faid Island, examined the Mulatto, who persisted in the fame Account, till being required to shew where the Riches were, he at length affirmed the whole to have been an Invention of his own, in order to procure the Means of returning to St. Antonio his Native Country, For this Procedure he was immediately put in Irons, and was brought on Board the Man of War hither, in order to be tryed. The Britifh Subjects were likewife ordered on Board, and upon their Arrival here were imprisoned. The British Conful has made a Representation in their behalf to the King of Portugal, and a

favourable Answer is expected. Lisbon, OH. 4, N. S. The Vice-Conful of Lisbon, Off. 4, N. S. The Vice-Conful of Vigo and the 13 English Mariners, which were brought hither Priloners from the Ifland of St. Antonio, were fet at Liberty on the 2d Instant : But the Mulatto, who was the Occa-fion of their taking that Voyage, has received Sentence of Death. His Britannick Majefty's Ship the Tryal Sloop, is preparing to fail from hence for Gibraltar.

Prague, OH. 9, N.S. The Departure of this Court for Vienna is fixed to the 6th of The Departure of next Month, and all the Chancelleries will fet out from hence on the 20th Inftant. 'Tis faid, Prince Eugene will likewise set out for Vienna in nine or 10 Days. Count Sinzendorff and the Marquels de Rialp will flay to attend the Emperour on his Journey : The Empress is to be carried all the Way in a Chair. The Vice Chancellour of the Empire fet out three Days ago for Mentz; and the Duke and Dutchels of Blankenbourg, the Emprefs's Father and Mother, will go from hence on the 15th Inftant.
