Their Excellencies the Lords Justices in Coun-

Their Excellencies the Lords Justices in Council, were this Day pleased to order, That the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the 24th of this Instant October, should be further prorogued to Tuesday the 19th Day of November next.

Lisbon, Sept. 28, N. S. Four Days before the came in the met with three Algerines from 50 to 60 Guns each, and engaged them; but Night coming on they were parted, and met no more. The Expedition the faid Ship was fent upon was this, The British Vice Consul of Vigo, having been affured there by a Mulat-to, a Native of St. Antonio one of the Cape de Verde Islands, that he knew of a considerable Treasure which bad been buried in that Island by a Crew of Pyrates, being what they had taken on Board a Spanish Packet-Boat; the faid Vice-Conful with 13 English Mariners and the Mulatto, went in June last in a Sloop from Vigo to that Island, upon this Discovery. This Court receiving Intelligence that they were gone with this Design, dispatched the Man of War abovementioned, with Order to feize that Treasure for the King of Portugal, the Island of St. Antonio belonging to this Crown. The Victory arriving at that Island, found the said Vice-Consul and Mariners, whose Sloop had been driven on shore there by a French Pyrate of 14 Guns. The Cap-

A T the Council Chamber Whitehall, the 22d | tain of the Portuguele Man of War soon after his Arrival at the said Island, exaafter his Arrival at the faid Island, examined the Mulatto, who persisted in the same Account, till being required to shew where the Riches were, he at length affirmed the whole to have been an Invention of his own, in order to procure the Means of returning to St. Antonio bis Native Country. For this Procedure he was immediately put in Irons, and was brought on Board the Man of War hither, in order to be tryed. The British Subjects were likewise ordered on Board, and upon their Arrival here were imprisoned. The British Consul has made a Representation in their behalf to the King of Portugal, and a

favourable Answer is expected.
