ON the 13th Instant General Armentariz, Viceroy of Peru, set out from hence for Cadiz; and it is said that if the Merchants Ships there are not ready to put to Sea the Beginning of next Month, four Men of War which are fitted out there for New Spain, will without waiting for them sail with the said Viceroy. Don Manuel de Alderete, Major-General and Lieutenant-Governour of Cadiz, having come hither from thence to solicit an Augmentation of his Pay, his Catholick Majesty has thought fit to nominate him President of the Royal Court of Panama, and Captain-General of the Province of Terrasirma, and ordered him to repair forthwith to Cadiz, to imbarck on the Men of War designed for New-Spain. Cardinal Belluga having lately brought from Rome a Bull for the Reformation of certain Ecclesiastical Affairs, his Catholick Majesty has referred the same to the Council of Castile, to examine whether there be any thing in it that intrenches on the Rights of the Regale, and whether on other Accounts it may be convenient to have it put in Execution. Their Catholick Majesties continue at St. Ildefonso.

Gohre, Oct. 28, N. S. This Morning the King, attended by the Lord Viscount Townshend and the Lord Carteret His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and by several English Gentlemen who have the Honour of being entertained here at His Majesty's Expence, went to a Heath a little Way from hence to take a Review of two Regiments of Horse and three of Foot of such of His Majesty's Forces as are quartered in this Neighbourhood. The King being accompanied by the Duke of York and by Prince Frederick, found waiting his coming on the Heath several of his General Officers and others, with a great Number of People of all Sorts, though this Place be at a good Distance from any large Town. The Regiments of Horse were, that of Lieutenant-General St. Laurent, and that of Colonel Bouich; and the Foot were those of Major-General Reck, Brigadier Hitzfeld, and Colonel Eimbec. They were all in excellent Order and made a very fine Appearance. His Majesty continues (God be praised) in
