The development consent is for the construction and operation of a wind farm within Clocaenog Forest, North Wales, comprising up to 32 turbines on concrete foundations incorporating hard standing for cranes, external transformers; cabling to connect the turbines to an onsite substation; a series of new tracks, improvements to and widening of existing tracks and public roads subject to widening; alternative sites for a substation compound; two anemometry masts; two civil construction compounds; four borrow pits; alternative locations for a temporary electrical compound; and ancillary works comprising the landscaping and clearance of vegetation, and the temporary stopping up of public footpaths during construction.
- 7. The proposed wind farm is located within Clocaenog Forest in the County of Denbighshire and the County Borough of Conwy. Clocaenog Forest is managed by Natural Resources Wales on behalf of the Welsh Ministers. The site is approximately 13km south of Denbigh and 10km west of Ruthin. The Application site comprises an area of approximately 1581ha within the forest. The elevation of the site ranges from 380 metres AOD to 502 metres AOD at Craig Bron Banog.
