T is faid the Infante lately born, will be chriftened next Week, for which Ceremony great Preparations are making at Admiral Perez, Ambaffadour from this Court. the Emperour of Morocco to the Court of Great Britain, left Gibraltar about a Fortnight ago, in his Way for England Commodore Scat with His Britannick Majefty's Ship the Dragon arrived here the 28th paft from Cadiz, as did the Day following Captain Purvis with the British Ship of War the Dorsley. The former fails for England the Beginning of next Week ; as does the Leopard Captain Medley Commander the End of this; the Durfley in a few Days returns to the Streights. Here are arrived from the Emperour's Dominions in the Adriatick, three Merchant-Ships, convoyed by two Men of War called the St. Charles and St. Barbara.

Turin, Nov. 3, N. S. Some Days ago the Count de Verle, Son to his Sardinian Majefty's Master of the Horle, attending the Queen from the Veneria to this City, his Horle fell with him, broke his Collar-Bone and diflocated his Shoulder. Many Promotions and Removals havel ately been made in the chief Magistracies of Piedmont and Savoy; and on the 25th past the Marquess Graperi, President of the Senate, was sent to Cherasco to be confined there, for excusing himself from going to re-fide as Chief Justice at Nizza. The Snows fide as Chief Justice at Nizza. The Snows having fallen pretty plentifully in the Mountains, it might be expected the Court would come earlier bither this Year than usual; but the Small Pox being very rife in this City, it is thought that on the Duke of Aouste's Ac-count the Court will forbear coming till that Diftemper be vifibly decreafed. Letters from Florence of the 22d paft relate, that on the 20th the Great Duke had a Fit of fo deep a Lethargy, that he shewed scarce any Signs of Life, and he continued fome Hours in that Condition: He recovered from it, but his Phyficians judged he could not laft long. This being St. Hubert's Day, his Sardinian Majefly with the Prince, and a great Number of the Nobility are gone out a Stag-Hunting. Let-ters from Pila of the 27th past advile, that feveral Boats were arrived there with warlike Stores, and that more were expected, to be laid up in that Citadel by Order of the Great Prince of Tufcany. We have no further Advices from Florence, relating to the Indif-position of the Great Duke ; the Letters which were due To-Day from thence, being not yet arrived.

Bruffels, Nov. 10, N. S. Thursday last be-ing the Festival of St. Charles Berromeo, whose Name the Emperour bears, it was celebrated bere with great Splendour : The Marguels de Priebeing indisposed, the Marchionels hu Lady received the Compliments of the principal Nobility and other Perfons of Diffiction of that Day. There was a more numerous Appearance at Court, than had been obferved any Time before on the fame Occafi-on. At Noon a triple Difcharge was made of the Cannon on the Ramparts of the City, and in the Park, where our whole Garrifon was under Arms, and made like Salvocs of Small Shot. The chief Perlons of Quality were magnificently entertained at Dinner at the Marquels de Prié's Palace. Io the Evening there was a Concert of Musick at the Theatre, and Part of an Opera performed, for the Di-version of the Court : And afterwards a Malquerade at the Marquels de Prie's Houle, till Five the next Morning. Prince Kourakin, after five Days Stay, went from hence on Satur-day laft. The Deputies of the Province of Flanders arrived here on Sunday, bringing with them the Act in Form of the Confent of that Province to the fettling of the Succeffion of the Austrian Netherlands on the Female Line, in cafe of failure of the Male; and alfo the Confect of the faid Province to the Subfidy demanded of them, amounting to near Seventeen Hundred Thouland Florins, Gohre, Nov. 6, N.
