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**A**T the Council-Chamber Whitehall, the 14th Day of November, 1723.

Their Excellencies the Lords Justices in Council.

Their Excellencies the Lords Justices in Council, were this Day pleased to order, That the Parliament which stands prorogued to Tuesday the 19th of this Instant November, should be further prorogued to Tuesday the 10th Day of December next.

*Madrid, Nov. 8.* Major General Guendica, Nephew to Sig. Armendariz, Viceroy of Peru, being made Governour-General of Lima, took the Oath for that Employment Yesterday in the Council of the Indies, and is to set out forthwith for Cadiz, there to imbarke with the Viceroy for New-Spain. The King has sent for the Marquess de Monteleone, his Ambassadour in Holland, in order to confer on him the Office of President of the Council of the Indies: And 'tis said Don Gaspar de Narbona, who served the Crown some Years in Sicily with great Reputation, will be made President of the Hazienda or Council of the Finances. The Queen Dowager residing at Bayone, being desired to be Godmother to the young Prince of Portugal, has writ to the Infanta of Portugal to represent her as her Proxy. The Court will remove from St. Ildefonso to the Escorial the 17th Instant, and are expected soon after to come and pass the Winter Season here.

*Lisbon, Nov. 13, N. S.* The Sicknes which has been rife in this City for some Time past, begins to abate. The Marquess de Capecelatro, the Spanish Ambassadour at this Court, is preparing an Equipage for his publick Entry, which it is said will be very soon; his Excellency being to represent his Catholick Majesty at the Baptism of the Prince lately born, to whom that Monarch is to be Godfather. On the 8th Instant her Portuguese Majesty, accompanied by the King and a great Number of the Nobility, went to the Jesuits Church here, to return Thanks for her late happy Delivery. On the 10th Instant His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Leopard, Captain Medley Commander, sailed from this Harbour for England; as will in a few Days the Dragon, commanded by Commodore Scott.

In Order to the Discovery of the Offenders, their Excellencies the Lords Justices are pleased to promise a Reward of One Hundred Pounds to any Person or Persons who shall make such Discovery, to be paid upon Conviction of one or more of the said Offenders: And also His Majesty's most gracious Pardon to any one of the said Offenders making such Discovery, except him or those who shot into the said House as abovementioned.
