Turin, November 17, N. S.

THE King of Sardinia came hither the 9th Instant from Rivoli, and had the Oath administered in his Presence to the new Judges and Senators whom he has lately constituted. The 10th being the Birth-Day of the Prince of Wales, the British Envoy gave a splendid Entertainment on that Occasion to a good Number of Persons of Quality. On the 11th, a Son of Prince Emanuel of Savoy, (who is Prince Eugene's Nephew, and Colonel of Horse in the Emperour's Service) arrived here from Vienna, in Order to be educated under the King's Eye at this Court: The Marquess de Cavour, Major of the Royal Regiment of Dragoons, is declared his Governour, and upon this Occasion is promoted to the Rank of Lieutenant-Colonel, and made one of the Gentlemen of the Bedchamber to his Sardinian Majesty. This young Prince, whose Name is Eugene, has since his Arrival lodged at the Princess Louisa's, but to Night is to remove to the Academy, where his Majesty has caused an Apartment to be furnished for him, and has made him a Present of a Service of Plate.

Paris, Nov. 26. The 24th Instant an Express arrived with Letters for the Duke of Orleans, advising that the Hereditary Prince of Modena was safely delivered of a Prince, at Regio: On which Occasion his Royal Highness received Yesterday the Compliments of the Court at the Palais Royal. The 21st Instant, and the two following Nights, the Ambassadors of Portugal made extraordinary Entertainments for the chief Persons of Quality and others of Distinction here, on Account of the Birth of the young Prince of Portugal.
