THE last Letters from Cadiz advise, that the Viceroy of Peru was daily expected there, and that upon his Arrival the Gallions would forthwith be dispatched. This Day His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Dursley Galley will sail from hence for Gibraltar and Port-Mahon, with a Supply of Money for those Garrisons.

Whitehall, November 26.

Yesterday in the Evening arrived an Express from Paris, with an Account, that his Royal Highness Philip Duke of Orleans died of an Apoplexy last Thursday Night the 21st Instant, in the 50th Year of his Age, being born the 23d of July, O. S. in 1674. On his Decease, the most Christian King named the Duke of Bourbon to be the First Minister.
