HIS Majesty left Gohre on Wednesday the 24th of last Month between Six and Seven a-Clock in the Morning, and arrived here at Four that Afternoon. Prince Frederick set out from Gohre that Morning likewise, and came hither in the Evening. The Lord Viscount Townshend and the Lord Carteret arrived here from Gohre the 25th. Their Lordships lodged at Zell the Night of the 24th, and were very magnificently entertained there, with the Gentlemen who accompanied them, and all their Retinue, by M. Lescour. The Lord Glenorchy, from the Court of Denmark, and Mr. Wich, from Hambourg, are come hither to attend His Majesty. The Marquess of Blandford and the Marquess of Caernarvon are arrived here, to pay their Duty to His Majesty.

Hague, Dec. 7, N.-S. The Convoy of Men of War and the Yachts, which are to attend His Britannick Majesty in his Passage over to England, arrived at Helvoetsluys on Sunday last the 5th Instant.
