N the 12th Inftant in the Evening, Mr. Stanhope, the British Ambassadour, TOturned hither from Arnedillo, where he had been some Weeks to use the Waters for his Health, and has found great Benefit by them. Catholick Majefty's Approbation of those Draughts. Lisbon, Nov. 27, N. S. On board were found 19 Christians of feveral Nations, four of whom are Portu-gueze; the Moors taken in her have been fince put into the Gallies here.
