Madrid, December 6, N.S. HEIR Catholick Majefties having deferred fixing the Time of their Return hither, it is believed they will continue at St. Ildefonfo as long as the good Weather lafts. The King has nominated feveral Officers to fill Ine King has nominated leveral Olincers to fill up the Commiffions which were become vacant among his Forces, and promoted others to Go-vernments of Places. Don Louis de Aponte is appointed Governour of the Town and Province of Cartagena in the Weft Indies, on Don Anto-nio Santander's declining that Employment : And Don Jofeph Ylafi is made Governour of the Ifland of St John de Puerto Rico of St. John de Puerto-Rico.

Genoz, Dec. 7, N. S. On the 1st Instant our Great Council met, and refolved, that there shall for the future be two Governours of Corfica, one to refide (as hitherto) at Bastia, and the other at Bonifacio, on that Illand. The Body of the late Duke of Orleans having lain in State at St. Cloud, where the utual Ceremonies were observed, from the 4th Instant till last Night, it was brought from thence about Five a Clock, with all folema Pomp, under the Direction of the Prince of Conti, appointed by his most Christian Majesty to fee the Funeral duely performed : The Proceffion paffed here through the Streets of St. flono é and St. Denys between 10 and 11 a-Clock, and about Three this Morning reached the Royal Abbey of St. Denys; where the Archbishop of Rouen, his late Royal Highness's chief Almoner, having de-livered the Corpfe to the Prior of the Abbey, in the Forms uled on fuch Occafions, it was placed in the Church of that Abbey, where after 40 Days (according to Cuftom) it is to be interred.
