St. James's, the 14th Day of January, 1723.

HIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to appoint John Seare, of Tring Grove, Esq; to be Sheriff of the County of Hertford.

Lisbon, Jan. 11, N. S. The 5th of last Month the Marquess de Capichelatro, the Spanish Ambassadour at this Court, made his publick Entry, and had his first publick Audience of the King of Portugal: On the 6th he assisted at the Baptism of the Infante of whom her Portugues Majesty was lately delivered, by Proxy from the King his Master as Godfather, as did the Duke of Cadaval in the same Capacity for the Queen Dowager of Spain as Godmother. The young Prince was baptized in the Patriarchal Church, and named Alexander. On the 18th past the Duke of Banhos set out for Madrid, having taken his Audience of Leave of their Portugues Majesties some Days before. Two of the Imperial Merchant Ships belonging to the Trieste Company, which arrived here in October last, were sold in this River; and the third failed from hence for Naples the 1st Instant, laden with Sugars, under the Convoy of the two Imperial Men of War the St. Carlos and the Santa Barbara. By a Vessel from Madcira we have Advice, that the Bahia Fleet which failed from hence in May last, met with very rough Weather upon the Coast of Brasil, and was dispersed; that some were obliged to put into Pernambuco, others at the Rio Grande, and others at Paraiba, only the Convoy with two or three of the Merchant Ships reaching the Bahia. The Fleet homeward-bound from Maragnao, consisting of four Merchant Ships, was likewise separated in their Voyage: One of them arrived in this Harbour some time ago, the other three were forced into Vigo, and did not get thither till the 22d past, under the Convoy of a Man of War which was sent to bring them safe thither. The last Letters from Cadiz advise, that the Gallies were fully laden, and would be ready to sail the End of last Month, but that no Day was fixed for their Departure. The Sickness which raged in this City till the End of November last, is now intirely ceased. His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Happy Brigantine, arrived here on the 2d Instant from Jamaica, and will shortly proceed for the Downes. The Deptford Man of War continues in this Harbour. This Letter goes by the Solebay Man of War.
