When we reflect on the many and fignal Pre-fervations of your facred Perfon from the Con-fpiracies of wicked Men at Home, and from the Dangers which attend your Majeffy as often as the Repose of Europe and the Security of the Pro-testant Interest call you Abroad ; we cannot but afcribe thef Bleffings to a fingular Providence, that watches over a Life fo precious to your Sub-jects, and of fuch Importance to the common Good of Mankind.
