ENVIRONMENT AGENCY SALMON AND FRESHWATER FISHERIES ACT 1975 WATER RESOURCES ACT 1991 ENVIRONMENT AGENCY FISHERIES BYELAWS

Notice is hereby given that the Environment Agency intends to apply to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for confirmation of byelaws made under the Water Resources Act 1991 which amend existing 1985 Southern Water Authority Byelaws. The byelaws will:-

- Prevent exploitation of salmon by net across Southern area.
- Allow netting of sea trout in the Beaulieu Estuary only in Southern area.

The byelaws will protect salmon across Southern area inland and coastal waters as the Environment Agency does not believe that their exploitation can be justified at the present time.

The byelaws protect sea trout from exploitation in all waters except the Beaulieu Estuary.

Copies of the byelaws have been deposited at the offices of the Environment Agency at the addresses shown below and will be open to inspection free of charge from Monday to Friday during normal office hours from the date of publication of this notice until Friday 10th August 2018. TIME BANDED COLLECTIONS FOR HOUSEHOLD AND COMMERCIAL WASTE

Under section 46/47 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 as amended, and section 20 and 22 of the London Local Authorities Act 2007, notice is hereby given that, following consultation on and adoption of the Barnet Waste Regulations 2017*, Barnet Council will implement time banded collections for household and commercial waste in Mill Hill Town Centre from Monday 30 July 2018.

The roads that will be included are:

- The entirety of Mill Hill Broadway
- The first 50 metres of Goodwyn Avenue from Mill Hill Broadway
- The first 50 metres of Mill Way, from Mill Hill Broadway
- Station Road, from Mill Hill Broadway to Brockenhurst Gardens
- Bunns Lane, from Hale Grove Gardens to Langley Park

Recycling and refuse waste will be permitted to be on the public highway during three set times a day, seven days per week. These times are:

- 06:00 09:30
- 17:00 19:30 commercial waste only
- 22:00 00:00 (midnight) commercial waste only

NO wheeled bins are permitted to be left on the public highways at any time, either within or outside of the set times listed above

Time banded collections will be implemented as part of the council's ongoing work to improve the quality of local environments and to reduce the level of illegal fly tipping of waste and highway obstruction.
