N the 26th past all the Ambassadours met at the Town-Houle about Noon, and opened the Congress in Form. The King of Sardinia's Demand, relating to the Artillery which was taken away by the Spaniards at their evacuating that Illand, was adjusted and fettled between the Spanish Plenipotentiaries and Count Provana the Sardinian Minister, preliminarily to the Opening of the Congress. This Day at Noon, the Spanish Plenipotentiarits having defired a Conference with the British and French Plenipotentiaries, communicated to them a Letter of the 17th past (which they had just received) from Don John Bapuft Orendain the new Secretary of State at Madrid for foreign Affaire, in which he acquaints them that the young King Lewis-had taken upon him the Government on his Father's Renunciation, confirms in the Name of the faid young King his Mafter all the Orders and Instructions they had before received relating to the Affairs of the Congrels, and directs them to affure all the Minifters" at the faid Congress, that the Alteration in the Government of Spain shall make no mannor of Change in the Measures already taken, and that the King will follow his Father's Steps in cultivating the most first and initize Union with the Crowns of Great Bri-tain and France. The Count de Santistevan, first Plenipotentiary of the Crown of Spain at the Congress, has also received Advice, that he is appointed to be one of the feven Cabinet-Counfellours to the young King ; that he is likewife-made Prefident of all the military Orders in Spain ; and that his Office of Maf ter of the Horle to the Prince of Afturias, is continued to him under the prefent King, in Reversion after the Duke d'Arco. The faid Count de Santificvan is not to return to Madrid, to take Poffeffion of thole new Employ-medts, till after the Congress here shall be brought to a Conclusion.
