Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Madrid, Jan. 24, N. S. On the 19th Instant at Night the new King and Queen arrived here; the next Morning the Infantes came hither; the 21st in the Evening their Majesties with the Infantes went publickly to the Church of our Lady of Atocha, accompanied by the chief of the Nobility richly dressed, and attended by the Horse and Foot Guards: The Mourning which the Court laid aside on that Occasion, is since resumed. On the 20th the new Cabinet Council assembled the first Time, his Catholick Majesty being present.

Gambray, Feb. 1, N. S. On the 26th past, the Day appointed for opening the Congress here at the Town-House, the Ministers went thither, each with two Coaches and a Pair of Horses, two Pages, four Gentlemen, and eight Footmen. Some Companies of Foot and a Troop of Horse were under Arms in the great Square before the Town-House, the Drums beating and Trumpets sounding at the Approach of every Ambassadour. Entering the Town-House, their Excellencies were received at the Foot of the great Stairs by M. de St. Contest and M. de Rottembourg, Plenipotentiaries of France, Gambray being within the French Dominions. The Ministers found very handfome and convenient Apartments fitted up for themselves and their Secretaries severally: After an Hour's Conference they all returned in the same Manner they came. A Regulation is preparing for their future Meetings, which is to be communicated to all the Ministers at the Congress for their Concurrence. On the 28th past the French, Spanish, and Sardinian Ministers meeting at the House of His Britannick Majesty's Plenipotentiaries, the Act was adjusted, and signed by the Spanish Ministers, for restoring to the King of Sardinia the Artillery that was taken from that Island by the Spaniards at the Time of their evacuating it, or the Value of the said Artillery in Money to be paid, within three Months, at Genoa: This Act being delivered to Count Provana the Sardinian Minister, he gave a Receipt for the same, wherein he engaged for his Master, that the Spanish Hostage at Turin shall be set at Liberty to go where-ever he pleases, assoon as the said Agreement shall be executed. This Affair, and that of the Emperour's Investiture of the Dutchies of Tuscany, Parma, and Placentia, in favour of the Infante Don Carlos Prince of Spain, are the two only Preliminary Points of the Quadruple Alliance that remained unperformed, and are now happily settled.

Paris, Feb. 5, N. S. The 2d Instant the King held a Chapter of the Order of Knights of the Holy Ghost, and nominated a great Number of new Knights of that Order. The same Day his Majesty made a Promotion of seven Marshals of France, viz. the Count de Broglio, the Duke de Roquelaure, the Count de Medavy, the Count du Bourg, the Marquess d'Alegre, the Duke de la Feuillade, and the Duke de Gramont. The Count de Buys, Lieutenant-General, is nominated to go Ambassadour to the Court of Great Britain.

Brussels, Feb. 9, N. S. On the 7th Instant at Night Advice was brought hither by an Express, that the Chapter of Liege having proceeded that Day to the Election of a Bishop, had chosen the Count de Berghes who is of an antient Family of Brabant.
