Madrid, Jan. 24, N.S. On the 19th Inftant at Night the new King and Queen arrived here; the next Morning the Infantes came hither; the 21ft in the Evening their Majesties with the In-fantes went publickly to the Church of our Lady of Atocha, accompanied by the chief of the Norbility richly dreffed, and attended by the Horfe and Foot Guards: The Mourning which the Court laid afide on that Occasion, is fince refumed. On the 20th the new Cabinet Council affembled the first Time, his Catholick Majesty being prefent.

Cambray, Feb. 1, N. S. On the 26th paft, the Day appointed for opening the Congress here at the Town-House, the Ministers went thither, each with two Coaches and a Pair of Horses, two Pages, four Gentlemen, and eight Footmen. Some Companies of Foot and a Troop of Horfe were under Arms in the great Square before the Town-Houfe, the Drums beating and Trumpets founding at the Approach of every Ambaffa-dour. Entring the Town-Houle, their Excellen-cies were received at the Foot of the great Stairs by M. de St. Conteft and M. de Rottembourg, Plenipotentiaries of France, Cambray being with-in the French Dominions The Ministers found very handlome and convenient Apartments fitted up for themselves and their Secretaries severally : After an Hour's Conference they all returned in the fame Manner they came. A Regulation is preparing for their future Meetings, which is to be communicated to all the Ministers at the Congrefs for their Concurrence. On the 28th paft the French, Spanifh, and Sardinian Mini-fters meeting at the Houfe of His Britannick Majefty's Plenipotentiaries, the Act was ad-justed, and figned by the Spanifh Ministers, for reftoring to the King of Sardinia the Artillery that was taken from that Illand by the Spaniards at the Time of their evacuating it, or the Value of the faid Artillery in Money to be paid, within three Months, at Genoa: This Act being delivered to Count Provana the Sardinian Minister, he gave a Receipt for the fame, wherein he engaged for his Master, that the Spanish Hostage at Turin shall be fet at Liberty to go where-ever he pleases, aftion as the faid Agreement fhall be executed. This Affair, and that of the Emperour's Invefti-ture of the Dutchies of Tufcany, Parma, and Pla-centia, in favour of the Infante Don Carlos Prince of Spain, are the two only Preliminary Points of the Quadruple Alliance that remained unperformed, and are now happily fettled.

Paris, Feb. 5, N.S. The 2d Inftant the King held a Chapter of the Order of Knights of the Holy a Chapter of the Order of Knights of the Holy Ghoft, and nominated a great Number of new Knights of that Order. The fame Day his Mz-jefty made a Promotion of feven Marshals of France, viz. the Count de Broglio, the Duke de Roquelaure, the Count de Medavy, the Count du Bourg, the Marquess d'Alegre, the Duke de la Feuillade, and the Duke de Gramont. The Count de Buys, Lieutenant-General, is nominated to go Ambassadour to the Court of Great Britain.
