THE Council of Castile having upon more mature Consideration represented to the Cabinet-Council, that for rendering authentick and valid the Renunciation of King Philip, and consequently the Authority of the new King, the Approbation of the Cortes is necessary, the Cabinet-Council have taken it into Consideration; and an Expedient has been proposed, viz. that Circular Letters should be written to all the Cities which have Right to send their Deputies to the Cortes, requiring of them separately their Approbation; but this is not yet determined. Yesterday a Chapter was held at Court of the Knights of the Order of the Golden Fleece, where King Philip's Renunciation of the Office of Great Master of that Order in Favour of his Son was read; and King Lewis having taken the Oath as Great Master, conferred the said Order upon six of the Persons to whom his Father had promised it; the other four not being qualified as yet, for want of the Dispensations necessary from Rome on Account of their having other Orders, which the Statutes of the Order of the Golden Fleece do not allow of.

Lisbon, Feb. 1, N. S. By the Prince Frederick, a Merchant Ship which arrived here some Days ago from London, a Model was brought of the British Crown, which is to serve as a Direction to the King of Portugal's Jeweller for placing the Jewels in the Crown here, and it is thought the Coronation of his Portuguese Majesty will be performed in May next. His Britannick Majesty's Ships the Deptford, Lime Galley, and Tryal Sloop, continue still in this Harbour. The Happy Sloop, another small British Man of War, is preparing to sail for the Downes. The 24th past this Court received Advice by a Courier from Madrid, that King Philip had resigned the Government to his Son the Prince of Asturias. The Spanish Ambassadour here has for these three Nights past celebrated the Accession of the Prince of Asturias to the Crown of Spain, with Illuminations and Bonfires.
