Stockholm, Jan. 22, O. S. On the 20th Instant arrived a Courier from Petersbourg, who came by the Way of Finland, and brought to M. Bestuchef the Muscovite Minister here, Credentials for taking on him the Character of the Czar's Envoy Extraordinary; which Credentials having been delivered to the Chan-cery, the faid Minister had this Morning an Audience of the King and Queen of Sweden, On the 19th died here Baron as Envoy. Hogo Hamilton, & Native of Ireland, General of the Artillery, in the 70th Year of his Age, having been only a Lieutenant at his entring into the Swedish Service. It has froze a little for some Days past, and here has also fallen a little Snow, but to Day it has rained again and is very mild Weather, which makes People begin now to despair of having any Winter at all that can be of much Ule for the Service of the Mines and Iron Forges, the Failure whereof will be a very great Loss to this Kingdom; and besides it is generally apprehended; that the wet Season we have had for fo long a Time has already spoiled the Crop of Winter Corn now in the Ground; fo that the Price of all Grain is rifen very confiderably of late; and without a sudden Change to Froft, it is feared we shall have a Dearth in this Kingdom before the End of the Year.

Hague, Feb. 15, N. S. The new Bishop of Liege has notified to the States General his Election, by a Letter written in very obliging Terms. The Council of State proposed lately

to the States General the increasing the Number of their Forces, and their High Mightineffee appointed certain Deputics to confider that Proposition. Those Deputies have made their Report, by which they recommend to their High Mightineffes the augmenting their Forces from the present Establishment of 34054 Men to 40858, by adding a certain Number of Soldiers to every Company of Foot d to every Troop of Dragoons, (the Caval & and the Swife to remain as they are.) Their H gh Mightineffes have fent to the feveral Provinces for their Confent to this Augmentation

Paris, Feb. 18. The Count de Clermont first Gentleman of the Bed Chamber to the Duke of Orleans, fet out from hence some Days ago for Madrid, to compliment in the Name of his Royal Highness the new King and Queen of Spain on their Accession to the Crown. M. d'Armantieres is appointed by his said Royal Highness to carry to the King of Spain the Badge of the Order of Knighthood of the Golden Fleece which the late Duke of Orleans bad. Letters from Britany give an Account, that they had lately such tempestuous Weather on that Coast, that a Number of small Vessels which were laden with Wine from Bourdeaux for the Ports of Britany were The Marshal Duke of Berwick is cast away. nominated to go and command in Languedoc, in the room of the Duke de Duras who is re-called from that Province. The 15th of this Month, being the Day on which the King entred into the 15th Year of his Age, his Majesty received the Compliments of the Princes of the Blood, and of the principal Lords of the Court.
