Madrid, Feb. 7, N. S. The Marquess de Monteleon is not arrived yet. The Marquess de Campo Florido has by the King's Leave resigned all his publick Employments: He was Presi-

dent of the Treasury, Secretary of State for the Dispatch of Affairs of the Treasury, and Superintendant-General of the Treasury. In his Room Don Blaseo Oroseo, one of the Royal Councellours of Castile, is made President; and the other two Offices are conserred on Don Fernando Berdes Montenegro, who was Treasurer-General of War.

Stockholm, Jan. 29, O. S. The 23d of this Month, being the Queen of Sweden's Birth-Day, her Majesty was complimented on that Occasion by the Senators, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, and in the Evening there was a Ball at Court. Last Night there was likewise another great Ball at the Royal Palace, on Account of its being the Day that bears the Name of the Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel, when their Swedish Majesties also received the usual Compliments on that Occasion.
