N the 5th Inftant the Body of Prince Dom Miguel, who was unfortunately drowned in this River, was found and carried to the Convent of St. Catherine, where it remains deposited. Eighteen Merchant Ships bound for the Rio de Janeiro are fully loaden, and two Men of War appointed to be their Convoy are ready, but they have received Orders to wait till the Beginning of the next Month, when two Ships fitted out for India will be ready to fail in Company with them. His Britannick Majesty's Ships Deptford, Lime-Galley, and Tryal-Sloop, continue in this Harbour.

Dublin-Cafile, Feb. 12. On the 10th Inflant his Grace the Duke of Grafton, Lord Lieutenant of this Kingdom, went with the ufual State to the Houfe of Peers, and the Commons being femt for thither, gave the Royal Affent to feveral publick and private Bills, and then made the following Speech to both Houfes.

My Lords and Gentlemen,

T H E R E now remaining no Bulinefs before you unfinished, it muss be a Satisfaction to us all, that we are come to the Conclusion of a Seflion, which has been carried into an unusual Length, occasioned partly by fome Delay in bringing in fuch Bills (before it was far advanced) as were thought proper for the Confideration of Parliament. As your private Affairs will probably, after so long an Attendance, call you into your respective Countries, I muss earnessly recommend to you, in your several Stations, the Care and Prefervation of the publick Peace: This desirable End will, in my Opinion, be greatly promoted by a vigorous Execution of the Laws against Popish Priests, to the Neglect of which, I muss tell you, is imputed in a great Measure the Encrease of their Numbers: I shall contribute my Part towards the Prevention of this growing Evil, by giving proper Directions, that henceforward such Persons only be put into the Commission of the Preace, who have diffinguiss the measure of their Fidelity to His Majesty, and by their fleady Adherence to the Protessant Interest. I am by the King's Command to thank you,

I am by the King's Command to thank you, Gentlemen of the Houfe of Commons, for the ample Supplies which you have given this Seffion, and to affure you of His Majefty's gracious Acceptance of them; all due Care fhall be taken, that the utmoft Frugality be obferved in the Application of the publick Money. As nothing can render the Aids you have granted more effectual for firengthning the Hands of the Government, and fecuring the Tranquility of this N*tion, than a perfect Union amongft Proteftants, I am fatisfied, from your known Loyalty to the King, and your Love of your Country, that you will promote and cultivate fo great a Bleffing; and the fame Principles muft induce you to difcountenance the reftlefs Endeavours of any, who may attempt to fow Jealoufies, or raife groundlefs Apprehenfions in the Minds of His Majefty's Subjects:

My Lords and Genslemen,

It is with great Pleafure, that I perfuade myfelf from your respective Address to me, that the Administration in my Hands has been to your Satisfaction. I must in Return assure you, that I

fhall make a faithful Reprefentation to the King of the Affections and Behaviour of his dutiful Subjects of Ireland; I will not fail to lay before His Majefty the true State of this Country, and fhall upon all Occasions recommend it to His Royal Grace and Favour.

And then the Parliament was prorogued to Saturday the 7th Day of March next.
